The meeting was opened by singing Brighten the Corner. Mrs. Francis Earhart read Psalm 67.

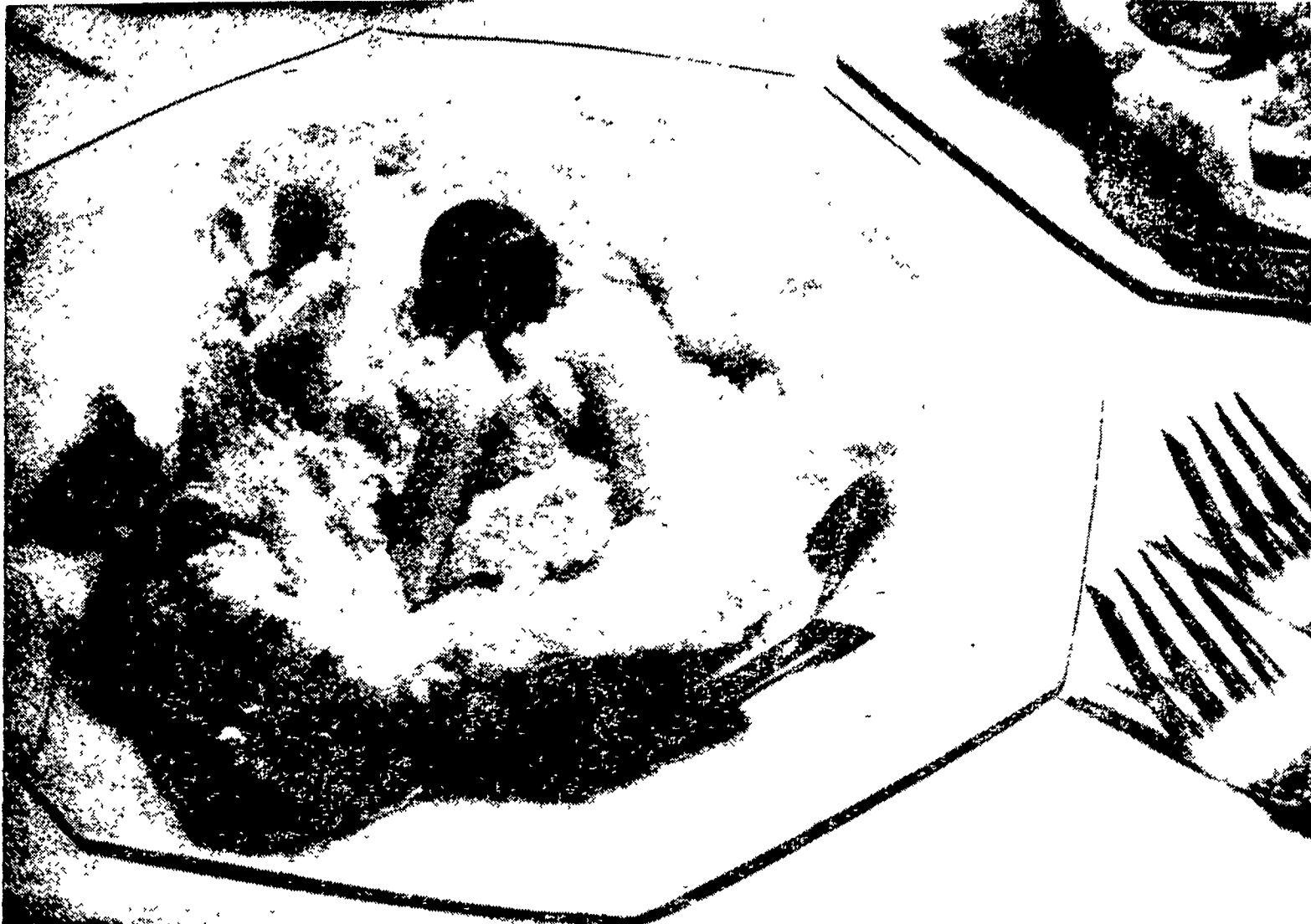
Roll call was answered by telling of helpful hints on freezing food.

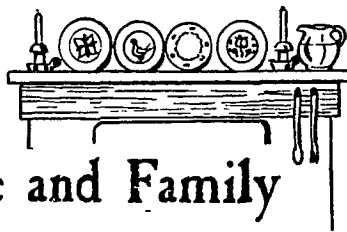

instead of water when you cook cereals. Directions for cooking cereals in milk are usually given

on the package.

You can step up milk value in many foods that contain fluid milk by adding nonfat or whole dry

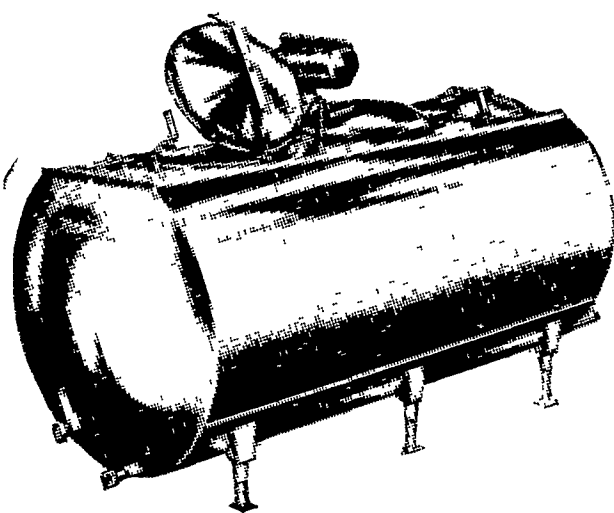
milk. Try this when preparing soups, mashed potatoes, cereals, and other cooked foods. If you add four tablespoons of dry milk to each cup of fluid milk, you make the food about twice as rich in milk value as it is when fluid milk alone is used.

Puddings and pie fillings made with evaporated milk will carry more milk into meals if two or more parts evaporated milk are (Continued on page ten)

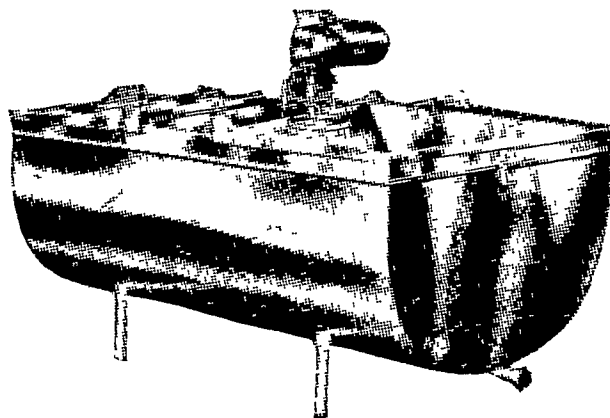

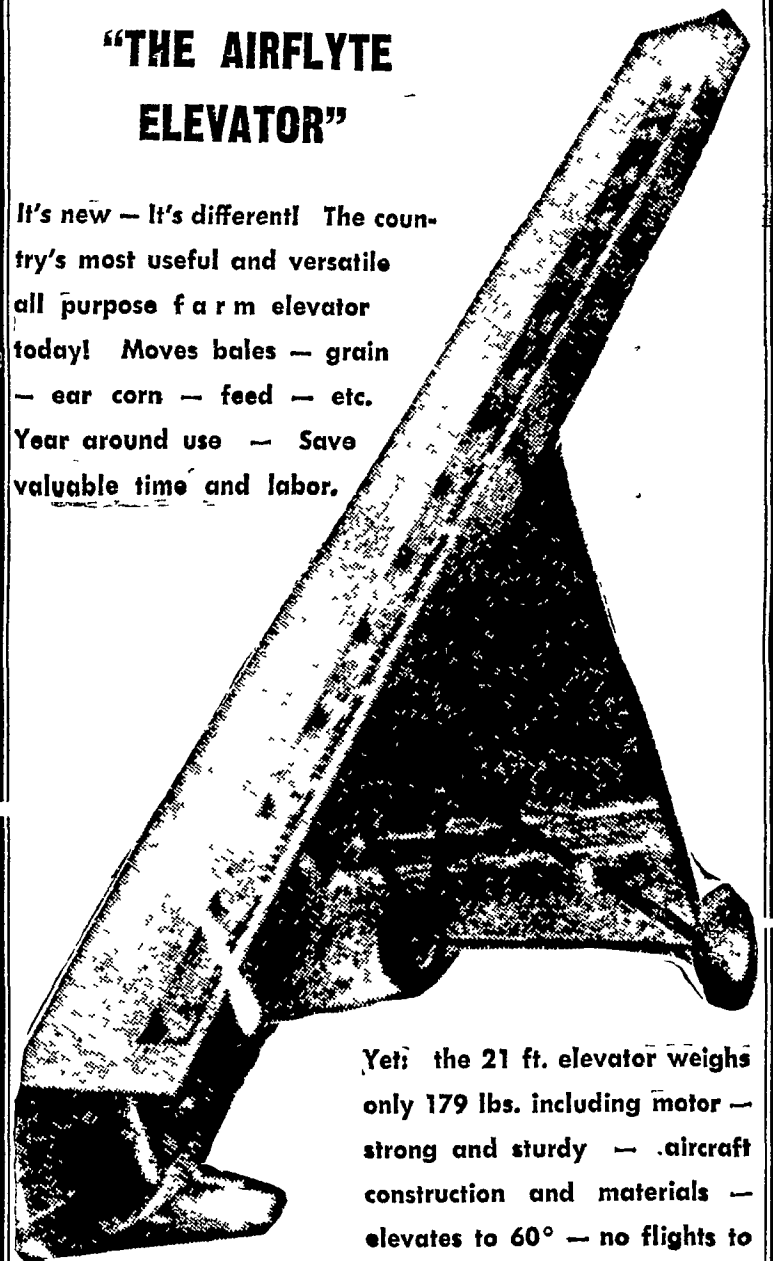
