

Only One Sale Weekly, on Thursday, To Be Held by Poultry Exchange

Effective June 27 there will be only one sale a week at the Lancaster Poultry Exchange, the Exchange Board of Directors announced this week.

The single weekly sale will be held each Thursday.

Declining listings for the Wednesday auction was given as the reason for the change.

LANCASTER — Thirty-four lots of broilers, 85,300 birds, averaged 218 cents Friday at the Lancaster Poultry Exchange. This price was about steady with the preceding Wednesday auction when only 30,000 birds were sold.

In addition to the broilers, 1,500 Leghorn fowl sold for 12½ cents, and 6,300 capettes in three lots brought from 22½ cents to 22¼ cents.

Lancaster Markets: Demand Fair; Steer Prices Steady to Quarter Down

LANCASTER—CATTLE: 3,717, week ago 4,173. A fair demand existed for slaughter steers locally this week. Compared with last Wednesday fed steers steady to 25 cents lower in a rather slow trade. Heifers scarce, steady. Cows steady to 25 cents lower. Bulls fully steady. Stockers and feeders extremely slow, weak to 25 cents lower.

Around 35 per cent of receipts were stockers and feeders and 10 per cent cows.

The fed steer supply graded mostly good and choice. Bulk

choice fed steers 1,000-1,300 lbs. \$23-24, high choice and mixed high choice and prime \$24.50-25.50, a couple lots 1,019 and 1,125 lb. prime steers \$25.75. Good and low choice steers \$21-22.75, some standard and low good \$19-20.50. A few small lots good and choice heifers \$19.50-23. Bulk cutter, utility and commercial cows \$13.25-16.50, canners and low cutters \$11-13. Utility and commercial bulls \$18-20.50, good fed yearling bulls to \$21. Bulk good grade stocker and feeder steers and light yearlings 480-900 lbs. \$21.50-23, a few light yearlings to \$23.50.

CALVES 900, week ago 833. Calves slow, particularly southern calves. Vealers half to dollar lower than last Wednesday. The decline mostly on good and choice grades. Bulk good and choice veal calves \$21.50-27, a few prime to \$28, utility and standard \$15-21.

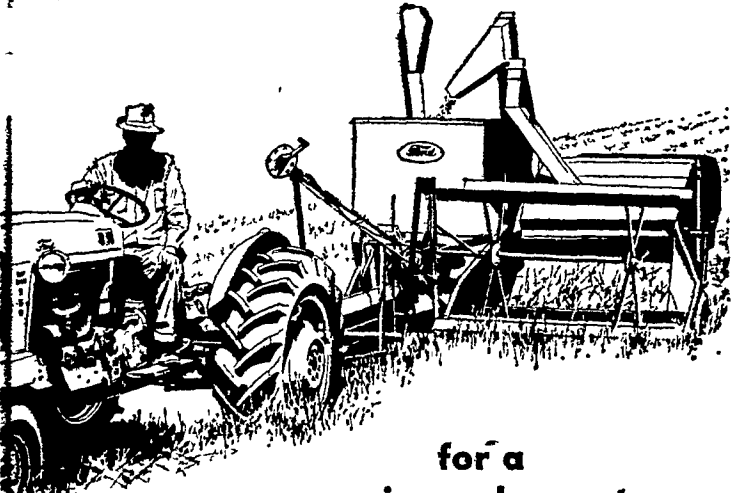
