

Broilers Average 22.97 to Stay High At Lancaster Exchange Thursday

LANCASTER — A heavy sale for the second consecutive week saw 170,545 broilers being sold Thursday for an average price of 22.97 cents, about two-thirds of a cent below the preceding week when the years high was hit at the Lancaster Poultry Exchange.

The price range was from 22½ to 24¼ cents.

A lot of 1,350 capettes sold at 23 cents, two lots of Leghorn fowl, 1,800 of them, sold for 12¼ and 13¼ cents, and three lots, 2,775 birds, sold from 26½ to 27¼ cents.

Lancaster Markets: Southern Cattle Help Swell Stocker, Feeder Market

LANCASTER—CATTLE 4,535, week ago 3,897. Stockers and feeders accounted for the larger number of cattle on sale this week as increased numbers of steers of southern origin, mainly from Virginia, were included in the arrivals. Stockers and feeders accounted for around 45 per cent of the offering. Cows-made up 12 per cent. Around 60 loads slaughter steers were on sale. A fairly good demand existed for fed steers and with trading moderately active prices mostly fully steady with last Wednesday, instances strong.

Heifers were scarce, steady; cows around 25 cents higher. Bulls held fully steady to strong. Stockers and feeders were more active than recent weeks with prices fully steady on stock steers, feeders strong to 25 cents or more higher.

Bulk choice fed steers 1,000-1,250 lbs. \$24.25-25.50, high choice and mixed choice and prime \$25.75-27, a couple loads 1,100-1,130 lb. prime steers \$27.25. Load 1,535 lb. choice and prime steers \$25.60. Good and low choice steers \$22.50-24, some standard and low good \$21-22.25. A few good and low choice heifers \$20-22. Cutter, utility and commercial cows \$13.75-16.75, canners and low cutters \$11-13.50

Utility and commercial bulls \$18-20.50, good fed yearling bulls to \$22.75. Bulk medium and good stock heifers and light yearlings 750 lbs. and lighter \$20.50-23. Several loads good and mixed good and choice 900-1,080 lb. partly fattened feeding steers \$22.50-24.50

CALVES 773, week ago 685. Veal calves fully steady with last Wednesday. Bulk good and choice vealers \$22.50-27.50, odd head prime \$28-29. Utility and standard vealers \$15-22.

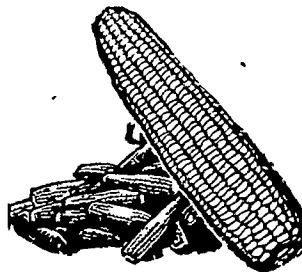

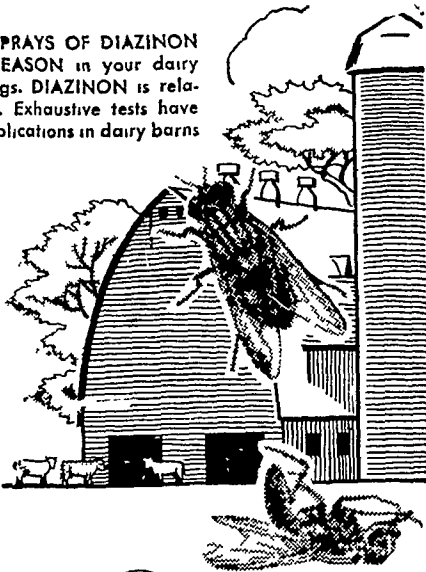
