1/2 teaspoon salt  
1 teaspoon cinnamon  
1/2 teaspoon nutmeg  
1/2 teaspoon powdered cloves  
1 cup canned applesauce  
1 teaspoon baking soda  
1/2 cup soft shortening  
1 cup granulated sugar  
1 egg  
1 cup seedless raisins  
1 cup ready-to-eat bran

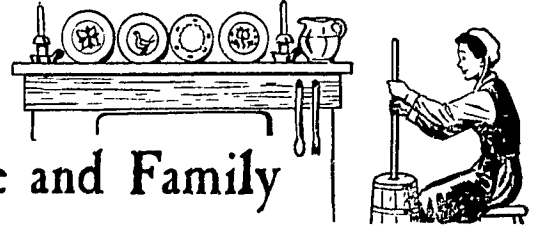
Heat oven. Sift together first five ingredients. Combine applesauce and soda. Mix shortening with sugar and egg until creamy. Mix in flour mixture alternately with applesauce. Fold in raisins and bran. Drop by teaspoonfuls, about 2 inches apart, onto greased cookie sheet. Bake about 20 minutes, until golden brown, in a 375 degree oven. Makes three dozen. This is a moist cookie.

### SPONGE DROPS

1/2 cup sifted enriched all-purpose flour  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
2 eggs separated  
1/2 cup granulated sugar  
1 tablespoon cold water  
1/2 teaspoon lemon extract  
1/2 teaspoon grated lemon rind  
1/2 teaspoon cream of tartar

Preparation: Beat egg whites together in clean bowl until stiff peaks form. Beat egg yolks together with sugar until thick and light. Fold in flour mixture and lemon extract and rind. Drop by teaspoonfuls on greased cookie sheet. Bake at 375 degrees for 10 minutes. Makes 2 dozen.

### COCONUT SPICE COOKIES

1/2 cup soft shortening  
1/4 teaspoon cinnamon  
1/2 teaspoon ginger  
1/4 teaspoon nutmeg  
1/4 teaspoon allspice  
2 tablespoons honey  
1 package white- or silver cake mix

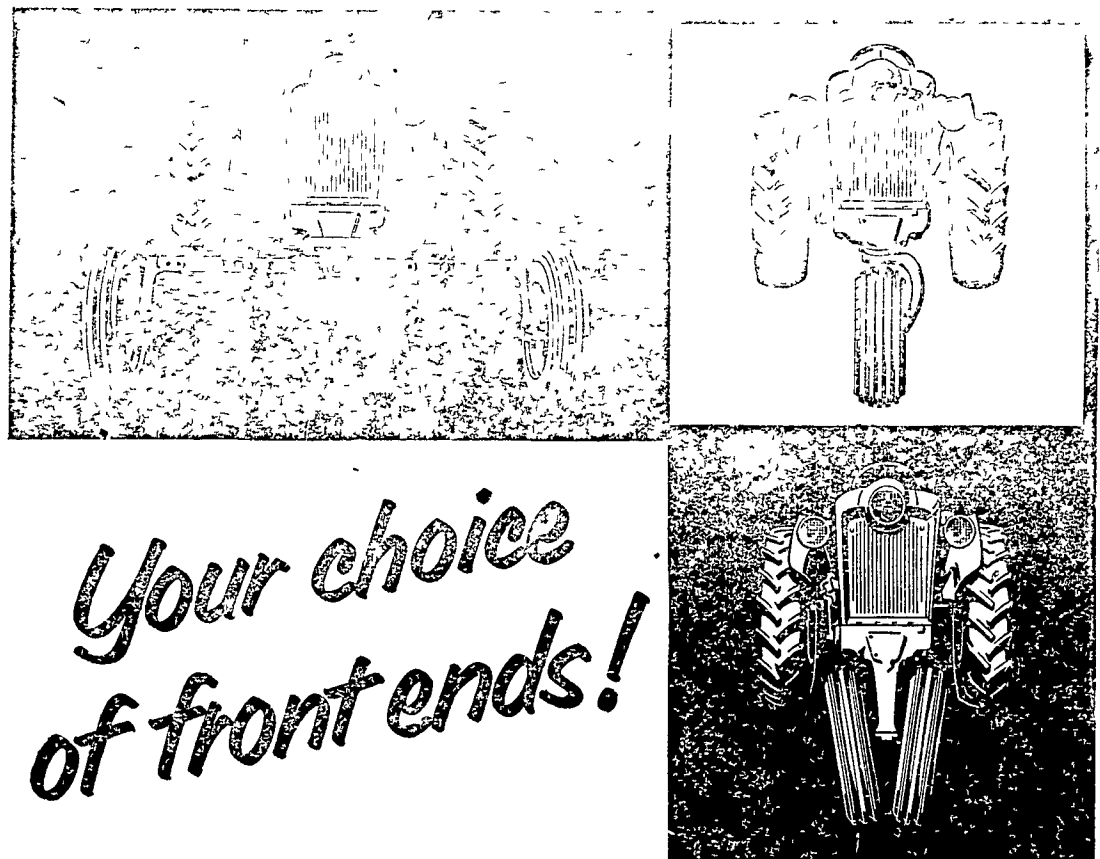
1 cup shredded coconut snipped.

Heat oven. Mix shortening with next five ingredients until creamy. Then using spoon, patty blend in, or fingers, work in white cake mix and coconut until fit a paste-like dough. Shape into small balls using about one teaspoon for each. Place on greased cookie sheet. Bake at 375 degrees for 10 minutes. Makes 2 dozen.

### CRINKLES

2 3/4 cups sifted enriched all-purpose flour  
1 teaspoon salt  
2 teaspoons baking soda  
1/2 teaspoon powdered cloves  
1 teaspoon cinnamon  
1 teaspoon ginger  
1 cup soft shortening  
1 cup brown sugar, packed  
1 egg  
1/4 cup molasses  
Granulated sugar

Sift together first six ingredients. Mix shortening, brown sugar and egg until very creamy. Mix in molasses then flour mixture. Chill one hour or longer. Roll into small balls and place on greased cookie sheet. Bake at 375 degrees for 10 minutes. Makes 2 dozen.

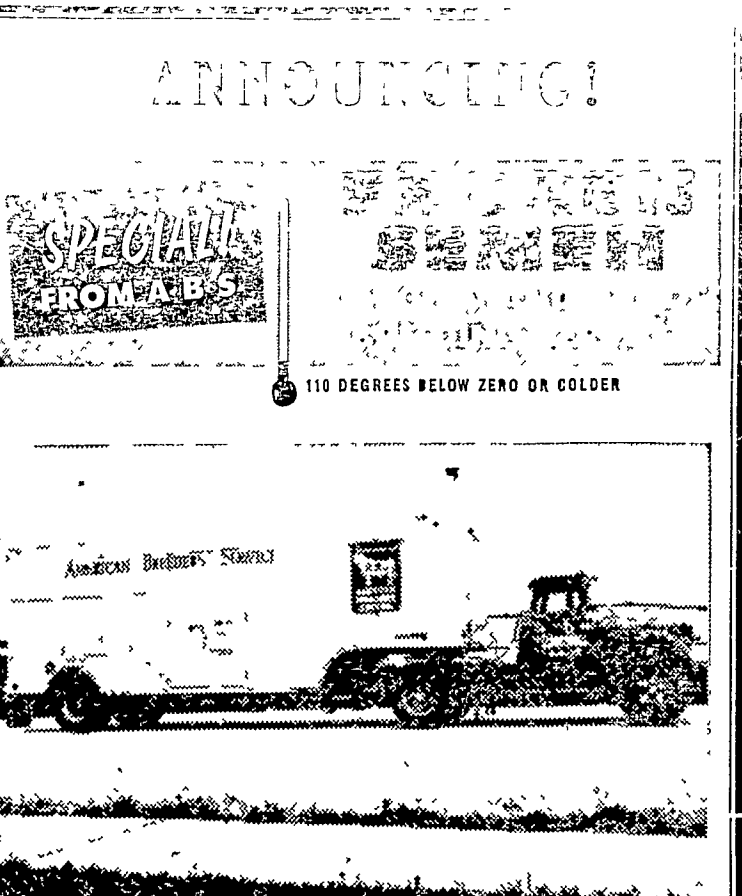
