

Broiler Prices Continue Rise; 24.08 at Lancaster Auction Thursday

LANCASTER — Broiler prices continued their upward spiral Thursday at the Lancaster Poultry Exchange when 136,800 broilers averaged 24.08 cents. At the corresponding sale last year the average was only 21 cents for 166,945 birds.

The price range for the July 25 sale was 23 1/4 cents to 25 1/2 cents. In addition to the broilers a lot of 850 heavy fowl sold for 20 1/4 cents and a lot of 380 Leghorn fowl sold for 13 3/4 cents.

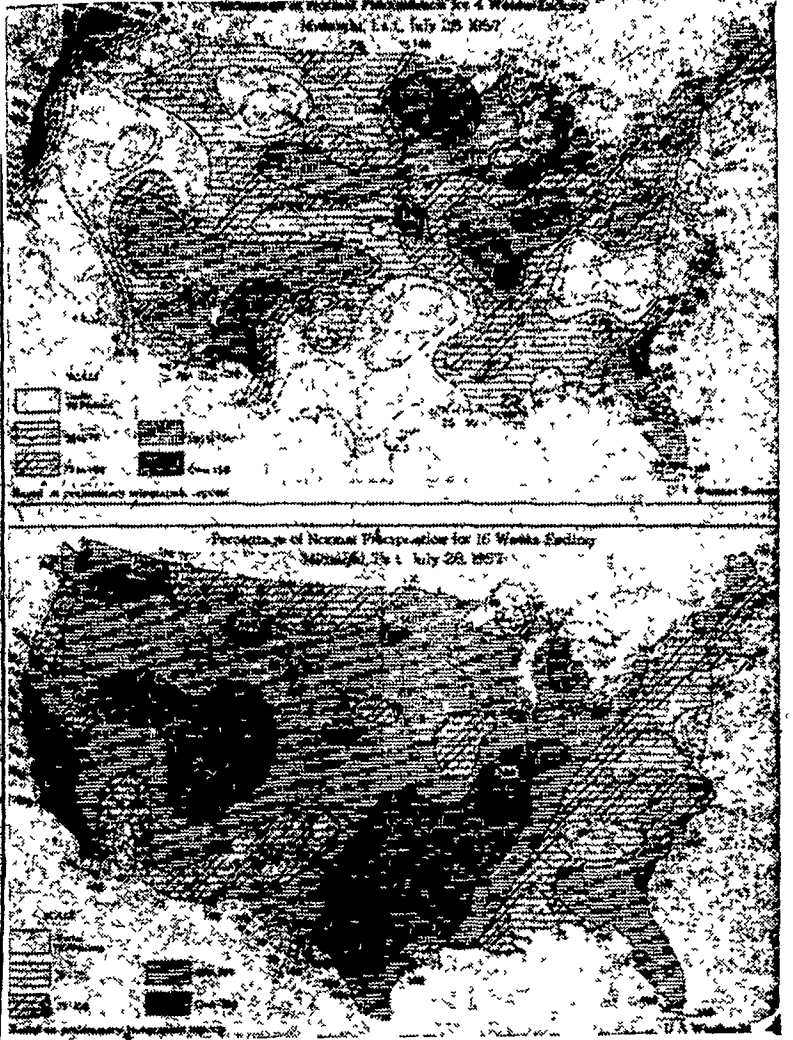

Field Bromegrass Promising Cover Crop

GENEVA, N. Y. — Research at the Cornell Experiment Station here shows that field bromegrass is a promising cover crop for cherry and peach orchards. When seeded in August at the rate of eight to 10 pounds an acre, it makes sufficient growth before winter to provide a good cover crop.

Another advantage of field bromegrass, the Cornell researchers say, is that it tills extensively.

On medium to highly fertile soils, they found that an excellent cover is produced and a good supply of organic matter is returned to the soil. On poor or eroded soils, application of from 100 to 300 pounds of 10-10-10 fertilizer at seeding time is recommended.



Lancaster Markets: Stocker, Feeder Demand Slack, Price Drops Dollar

LANCASTER—CATTLE; three days 3,696, week ago 5,213. Smaller receipts early this week could be attributed to a slower movement of grass cattle from southern states. Continued dry weather in the local area appeared to limit the demand for stocker and feeder steers and prices now \$50-1.00 lower than last week's close, in-

stances off \$1 50. Slaughter steers mostly steady except for some weakness on grades low choice and below. Cows around 25 cents lower, bulls weak to 50 cents lower. Around 55 loads of fed steers were included in the week's offering. Approximately 15 per cent of the receipts were cows and 15 per cent bulls and heifers, balance stockers and feeders.

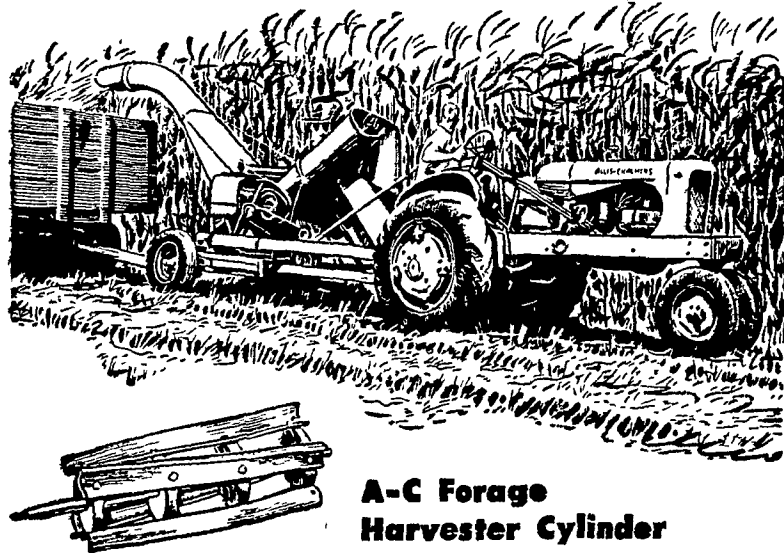
