

## Broiler Price Eases to 23.57 Cents At Lancaster Exchange Thursday

LANCASTER — The broiler price eased a little to an average of 23.57 cents at the Lancaster Poultry Exchange Thursday.

Thirty one lots, 105,750 broilers, sold from 23¼ to 24¾ cents.

Last year at the corresponding sale 177,700 broilers averaged 20.88 cents

At the Thursday sale a lot of 1,000 Silver Cross cockerals sold for 21¼ cents, a lot of 800 Leghorns sold at 13½ cents, 975 heavy fowl sold for 19¼ cents, a lot of 250 pullet capettes brought 29¼ cents and a lot of 1,400 capettes sold for 25½ cents.

## Lancaster Markets: Slaughter Steers Steady to \$.25 Higher; Trading Slow

Lancaster Cattle 3,932, three days last week 3,696. Compared with last Wednesday slaughter steers steady to 25¢ higher, instance 50 cents up. Most of the advance confined to high choice and prime fed steers. Heifers fully steady. Cows steady to 25, instance 50 cents higher than last Wednesday. Bulls weak to 50 lower.

Extremely dry weather locally continues to slow trading on stockers and feeders, prices mostly steady. Supplies comprised around 35 per cent stocker and feeder steers and 15 per cent cows. Around 60 loads slaughter steers on sale.

Bulk Choice fed steers 1,000-1,250 lbs. \$24.50-26, high choice and mixed choice and prime \$26.25-27, a couple loads mostly prime 1,182 and 1,300 lb. fed steers \$27.25. Load prime 1,400 lb. steers \$27.35 and load 1,300 lbs. \$27.50. Good and low choice steers \$22.50-25 some standard and low good \$20.50-22 A few head good and low choice heifers \$20.50-23. Bulk utility and commercial cows by Wednesday \$13.50-15-25, best action on grades utility and below. Canners and cutters \$9.75-14-75. Bulk utility and commercial

bulls \$16.75-19. 50, good fed yearling bulls to \$21.50, some cutter bulls \$13-15. 50. Bulk medium and good stocker and feeder steers and light yearlings 485-950 lbs. \$19.50-22 A few lots good fleshy feeding steers 900-1,050 lbs. \$21.50-22 50, small lot 1,050 lb. high good feeders \$23.50 Some common and medium stock steers 700 lbs. and lighter \$16.50-19.00.

HOGS: Barrows and gilts steady to 25 cents higher than last Wednesday Demand very narrow in the middle of the week's trading with the market poorly tested A few head barrows and gilts mixed U S 1-3. 190-230 lbs. \$23-23.50, a few No. 1 and 2, \$23.75. Around 125 head unsold late Wednesday Sows strong to 50 cents higher. Bulk sows mixed U S 1-3, 270-550 lbs. \$14-17.50, a few to \$18.

SHEEP: 582, week ago 630. Supply mainly native spring lambs, slaughter lambs fully steady. Bulk good and choice spring lambs 75-95 lbs \$21.50-24.50, a few high choice \$25.00, utility and low good \$15-21.

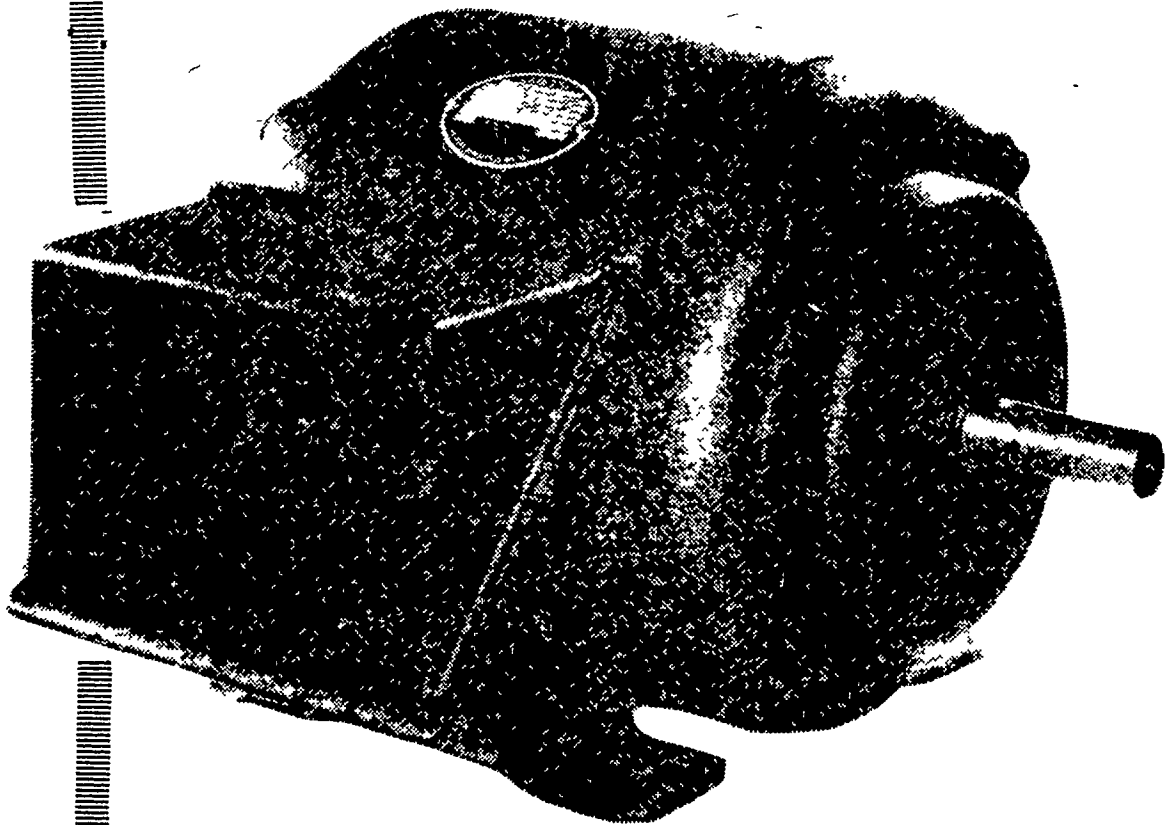
