

Clean Water Troughs are Important.


Cleans water troughs and fountains at least. once a day. This is not to prevent disease. It is to encourage water consumption. Sure, a chicken will drink out of a mudpuddle That tastes good. But water out of a slimy, stinking fountains doesn't taste good. I've seen clean fountains jump production 20 per cent in three weeks time. If you debeak your birds be sure the water is at least two or three inches deep in the fountains and easy to get at.


