Dairymen in Northeastern Area Can Expect 10 Per. Price Increase

Governor George M. Leader Friday said that Northeastern Pennsylvania dairy farmers could expect a 10 per cent increase in their milk checks thanks to the work of the Northeastern Pennsylvania Dairy Farmers Committee which he appointed in October of last year.

The Governor spoke at the 100th Annual Fair of the Harford

Agricultural Society, in Harford, Pa.

"Until Aug. 1, 1957," Governor Leader said, "Pennsylvania milk sold in New Jersey was not regulated by the Federal Government, largely because the dairy farmers of New York and New Jersey couldn't get together on the kind of regulation they needed

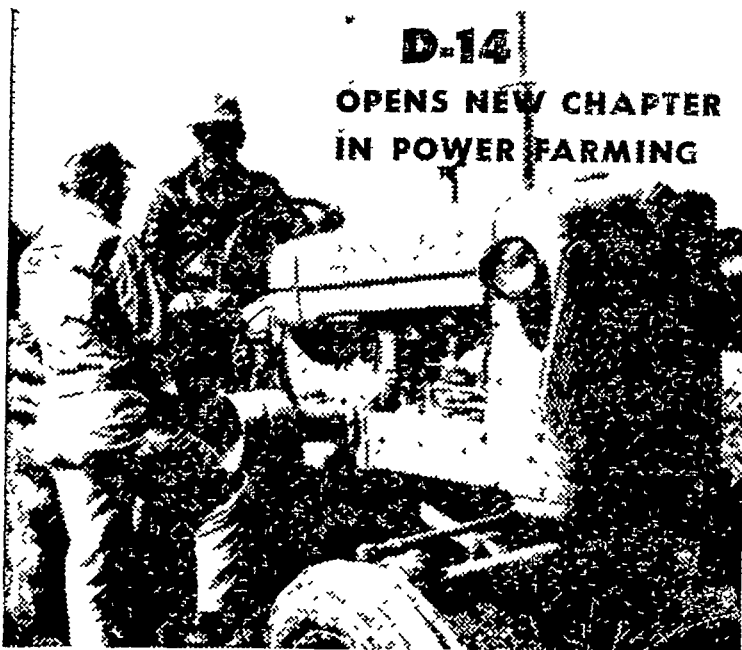

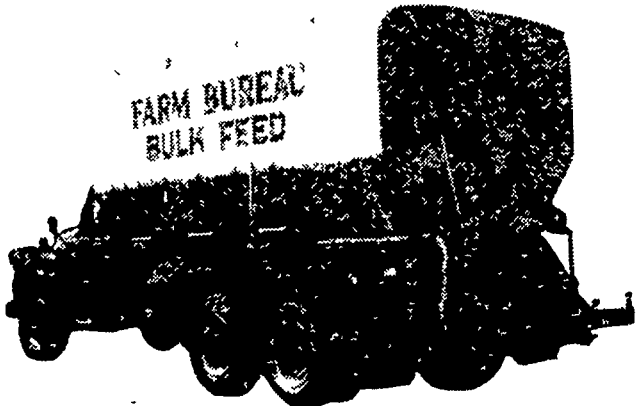
