

## Less Than Month Left to Enroll In 4-H Baby Beef Clubs for 1958

Less than a month is left for interested boys and girls to enroll in one of the 4-H Baby Beef Feeding projects, says County Agent Max Smith. Boys and girls 10 to 20 years old are eligible.

The Red Rose Baby Beef and Lamb Club operates as the county-wide club with 125 members during 1957. Each member is required to feed at least one steer for a twelve month period.

Calves are distributed in November through an organized distribution plan.

Members of the Red Rose Club feed their steers for the following major shows: Southeast District Show at the Lancaster Union Stock Yards in November, the Pennsylvania Livestock Exposition in Harrisburg in mid-November, the Eastern National Exposition at Timonium, Md., in mid-November, and the State Farm Show in January.

In the New Holland area a separate baby beef club is operated where steers are exhibited and sold at the New Holland Farm Show.

Youths interested in joining the Red Rose Club can submit their name and address to any member of the club, to the county Extension Office in the Lancaster Post Office Bldg., or to any of the following club leaders: Ira L. In addition to learning how to fatten, fit and show a beef animal, the members meet monthly to gain experience in conducting and taking part in meetings and to participate in educational and recreational activities.

Parents are urged to enroll their youngsters in one of these clubs, to give the boy or girl an animal of their own and to help them learn by doing.
