Miss Mary Keene Tops Mt. Joy Fair With Pen of Three Southdowns

Miss Mary Keen, R1 Christiana, proved again last week that she knows how to feed and show sheep. A championship winner at the last State Farm Show, she topped the field at the Mt. Joy Community Farm Show with a pen of three Southdowns.

Reserve championship in the show was taken by Fred Hess, R1 Bareville, with a pen of Hampshires.

Tom King, livestock specialist from Pennsylvania State University, judged the 10 pens in the show.

Darwin Boyd, R1 Ephrata, had the first place Shropshire pen and David Witmer, Neffsville, had the best pen of Cheviots.

In the Swine show, a Yorkshire was the Grand Champion. The 234-

pound barrow, raised and shown by John Risser, R2 Hershey, was sold Friday night for 41 cents a pound to Longenecker's Meat Market, Elizabethtown.

The reserve champion, also a Yorkshire, was shown by Janet Miller, R3 Elizabethtown. It was knocked down at the sale for 25 cents a pound to York Livestock Market.

In the baby beef show Mary Louise Miller, 20, R2 Manheim, took home the purple rosette by winning with her Shorthorn steer, Dandy.

In second place was an FFA entry shown by Luke Brubaker, R1 Mt. Joy. The steer, a Hereford, is scheduled to be shown at the Pennsylvania Livestock Exposition next month.

Martin Witman Wins Second Title In County Level Land Plow Contest

For the second consecutive year, Martin Witman, R1 Marietta, won the level land plowing contest held in conjunction with the Mt. Joy Fair. Second was Mrs. Raymond E. Miller, R1 Denver.

Witman was sixth in the state contest at Hershey this summer. To win the contest, he drove an Allis Chalmers WD 45 pulling an IHC Little Wonder plow. This plow was one of the earliest that was made for tractor use, and is no longer in production.

Witman now uses it only for plowing contests. He also had it equipped with cover boards, which, he said, make a real difference in the finished job.

The runner-up, Mrs. Miller, is eligible to compete next summer at Hershey in the contour contest. She is the mother of a three year old son, Galen Ray. She and her husband, operate a 70 acre general farm. To win the contest, she drove a CA Allis Chalmers with a mounted two-share 14 inch plow.

Mrs. Miller beat out her husband by 29 points.
