Chester County Farmers Reminded To Use Enough Fertilizer on Grains

Winter grain acreage that will be seeded down next spring to hay and pasture mixtures needs adequate plant nutrients this fall and next year, points out Associate County Agent Joseph H. Way of Chester County. He says research conducted at the Pennsylvania State University has shown the following system to be most profitable for fertilizing fall sown small grains which are seeded down to grasses and legumes.

Drill deeply across the prepared seedbed 400 pounds per acre of 0-20-20 fertilizer or its equivalent. When drilling the small grain drill an additional 300 pounds per acre of 5-10-10 fertilizer. The pre-planting application of 0-20-20 is applied to help establish a good new seeding next spring and to enable the soil to provide enough plant nutrients for the first hay or pasture production year.

Meat Production Down; Pork Drops 8 Pct.

During the first eight months of 1957, commercial production of red meat in this country totaled 16,855 million pounds according to latest Crop Reporting Board figures.

This is three per cent less than the 17,447 million pounds produced during the first eight months of 1956.

Of the various types of red meat produced, beef was down one per cent from 1956, veal was down two per cent, pork, down eight per cent, mutton and lamb down two per cent, and lard down eight per cent. Production of red meat this past August is reported to be one per cent below July 1957 and three per cent below August 1956.
