Angus Assn. **Approves Herd** Classification

The October board meeting of the American Angus Assn. at St. Joseph, Mo., marked a historic occasion for the purebred beef cattle industry. The Angus board of directors unanimously approved the herd classification program which it has been studying for many months. It is the first time a major beef breed has undertaken such a constructive program on a nationwide basis.

Herd classification by the Assn. will be voluntary and will be conducted on registered cattle owned by its members. Officials feel that the program will not be started until some time in 1958. This will provide additional time to work out the mechanics of handling classification.

Under the new herd classification program, each breeding animal in the herd will have a uniform, unbiased rating, according to type. As the years pass, these records will provide a fairly accurate check on herd progress.
