11 Keystone Breeders Trying National Show

Having won honors with exhibits at past Pennsylvania Farm Shows, 11 Pennsylvania breeders of registered beef cattle are in line for attainment of national laurels next month

The occasion is the first annual Pennsylvania National Livestock Exposition in the Farm Show Building Nov 12-16 The Farm Show is restricted to Pennsylvania producers but the coming livestock show is "open to the world." according to Leon Falk, Jr, exposition chairman

Falk said that 207 cattle, swine and sheep breeders from 20 states and Canada are sending 2,700 head of beef cattle, swine and sheep to the open show More than 100 of these are Pennsylvania livestock men and 11 have won beef cattle championships, banners, ribbons and other awards at the 1956 or 1957 Pennsylvania Farm Shows

Included in the list of exposition entries is the Bengall Hereford Farm, Riegelsville, Bucks County, which won 11 first places and five second places at the 1957 Farm Show last January. Millard Farms, Annville, Lebanon County, had the next best record

at the Farm Show with firsts, one second and one third place in the Angus beef cattle show

The first Pennsylvania Livestock Exposition is designed to advance the entire livestock breeding and feeding industry according to State Agriculture Secretary William L. Henning It is expected to provide incentive for an increasing number of quality breeding stock to be seen at the 1958 and future Farm Shows, he said
