

## Lancaster Broiler Market Jumps Back as Birds Average 18.31 Cents

LANCASTER — The broiler market at the Lancaster Poultry Exchange jumped back from what will probably be the years' low last week as 156,650 broilers averaged 18.31 cents.

This compares with an average of 18.17 cents paid for 123,600 broilers at the corresponding sale last year.

Only 900 capettes were sold at an average of 24 cents, 250 turkey hens brought 29 cents and 1,925 Leghorn fowl ranged from 11 1/4 to 12 1/2 cents.

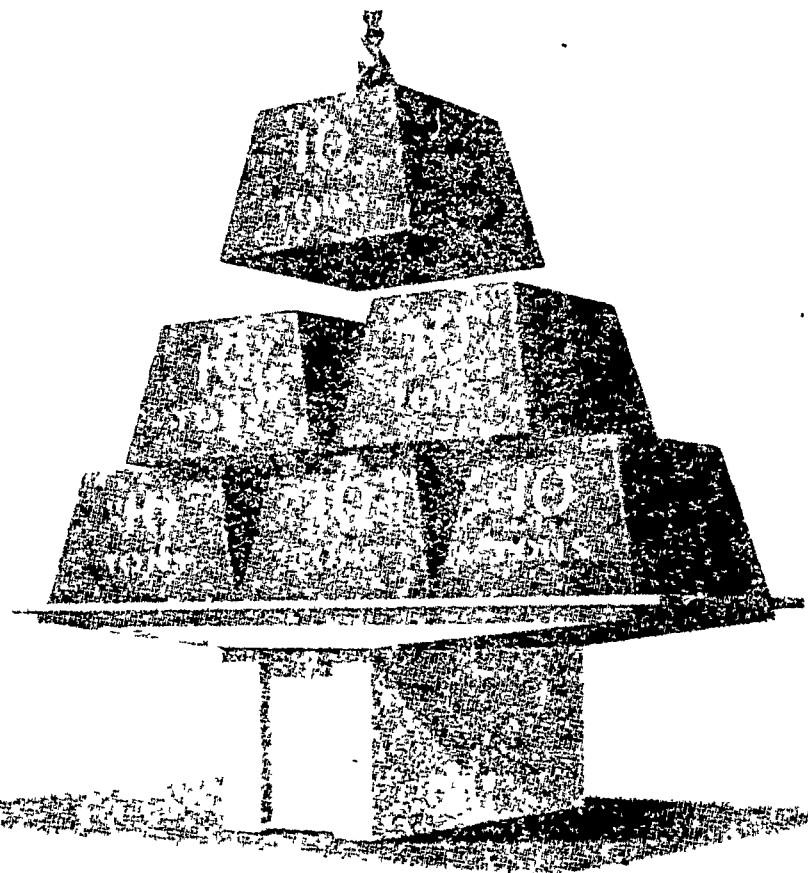
