Warren Lininger Shows Both Top Animals in Spotted Poland Class

C. Warren Lininger, R2, Denver, won the championships in both boars and sows of the Spotted Poland China breed at the Pennsylvania Livestock Exposition.

Reserve championships in both boars and sows went to William M. Kauffman, York, R3, York County, Pa.

Wendell McKissick, Slippery Rock, Butler County, Pa., won the championship in sows of the Berkshire breed.

In boars, the Berkshire championship went to C R Galbreath & Sons, Street, Md., while the reserve title went to Harold H. Yake & Son, Cardington, O.

Arthur Jordan, Ohio State University, was judge.

Oscar W. Anderson & Sons, of Leland, Ill., won champion and reserve boar and champion sow in the Poland China breed.

Myron O. LeVan, R2, Watson town, Northumberland County, won the reserve championship in sows.

Arle Anderson, Elizabethtown, Pa., was judge.

Exhibitors of barrows from four states, including Pennsylvania shared champion and reserve champion honors in the Yorkshire competition.

An Oscar W. Anderson, Leland, Ill., entry was selected as the grand champion market barrow and C. R. Galbreath and Son, Street, Md., showed the reserve grand champion. Galbreath also exhibited the grand champion pen. Harold H. Yake and Sons, Cardington, Ohio, showed the re-

serve grand champion pen.

Reno H. Thomas of Beavertown, Snyder County, Pa., exhibited the champion barrow and the champion pen of barrows and Park F. Thomas also of Beavertown, won ribbons for the reserve champion barrow and the reserve champion pen.

Wilbur Plager of Des Moines, Iowa, judged the barrows.

Treated Fence Posts Last Four Decades

Split red cedar fence posts, treated by soaking them in hot and cold baths of gas-tar cresote and set in the ground in 1917 are still in good condition, according to a recent report from Colorado State University.

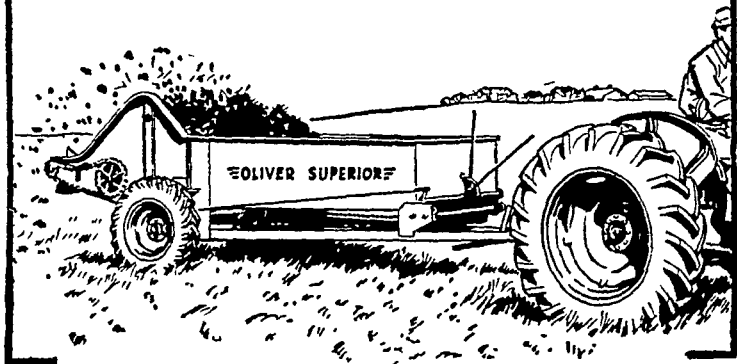
When examined a short time ago, after 40 years in the ground, the posts did show the effects of weathering and repeated burnings of the fields, but they were unaffected by insects or decay.
