Barrows and gilts sold generally 25¢ higher than last weeks close with sows moving unevenly steady to 25¢ higher.

Most mixed lots U S No. 1, 2 and 3, 180-230 lb barrows and gilts were taken at \$18.75 with a truck load 200 lb. hogs reaching \$18.85. There were U. S. No. 1, 2 and 3, 300-400 lb sows at \$16.00-\$16.50 with a few 270-300 lb. averages at \$17.00-\$17.25.
