PHILADELPHIA, Nov 27 — Unsettled Demand was light for moderate supplies of most classes. Buying interest centered on yearling hens capons and caponnetted fryers Turkeys especially hens were in improved demand for late buyers with supplies short Toms were liberally available without clearing.

PHILADELPHIA, Nov 27 — Weak on large eggs and about steady on mediums. Prices declined 3¢ on large. Offerings increased and demand was relatively lighter.

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 27 — Processed poultry, ready-to-cook (ice packed) young chickens — barely steady. Light volume of arrivals were more than adequate for the light demand as turkeys dominated bulk of trading.

Prices paid delivered warehouse, Philadelphia (cents per lb.) Grade A & US Grade A, 2-3 lb 27 1/2-30, mostly 27 1/2-28. Hens: Ready-to-coo (ice packed) steady. Demand continued good. Supplies were fully sufficient for immediate trade needs. Prices paid delivered warehouse, Philadelphia (cents per lb.) Grade A & US Grade A 4-5 1/2 lb 30 1/2-31. Receipts Nov. 26 — 189,000 lbs — included other than turkeys: Md. 71,000 lbs; Del. 67,000 lbs; N. Car. 12,000 lbs; Va 21,000 lbs.

HOGS. The bulk of the offerings in the hog division consisted of barrows and gilts weighing 180-230 lbs. weights under 180 lbs. and over 230 lbs. were almost entirely absent from the days trading and the sow percentage was rather small. Barrows and gilts sold generally 25¢ higher than last weeks close with sows moving unevenly steady to 25¢ higher.
Most mixed lots U S No. 1, 2 and 3, 180-230 lb barrows and gilts were taken at \$18.75 with a truck load 200 lb. hogs reaching \$18.85. There were U. S. No. 1, 2 and 3, 300-400 lb sows at \$16.00-\$16.50 with a few 270-300 lb. averages at \$17.00-\$17.25.
