Supplies comprised around 50 percent stocker and feeder steers and percent cows and bulls. Balance mainly good and choice slaughter steers and heifers. Prime grade fed steers were scarce. Bulk choice fed steers 1000-1300 lbs \$24.00-26.25, a few high choice steers 931-1185 lbs. \$26.50-26.75. Load 1400 lb. Choice steers \$24.00. 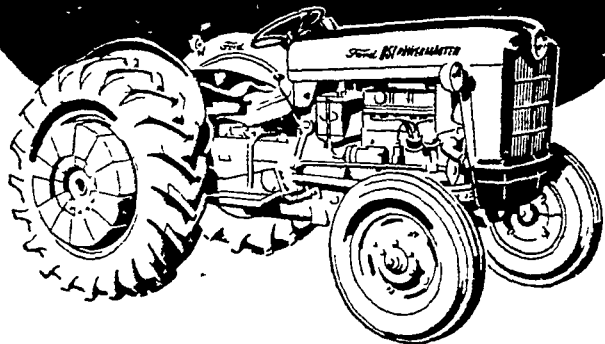
## Stabilization Office Cited as Best in Entire State
