## Indiana Hereford International Grand Champion Steer; Brings \$30

Green Meadows, PSU Entries Also Prove Champions

CHICAGO — A 1,000 pound Hereford steer, born in Texas and raised in Indiana, was named grand champion steer of the year at the International Livestock Exposition Showing the grand champion of the show was Mrs. Sue L. Secondino of New Goshen, Ind., a 19 year old bride of nine months. The steer is named, Honeymoon since Mrs. Secondino and her 23 year old husband, Pete, purchased

the animal at the Straus Medina Hereford Ranch in San Antonio during their honeymoon trip.

The steer was sired by TR Zato Heir 88.

Pennsylvania State University, which showed the grand champion steer last year, a Shorthorn named PS Troubador, was not shut out of the winners circle completely. Their pen of three Angus steers won the grand championship and a good little Hereford

steer ran second to "Honeymoon" all through the competition. He won the grand championship of the Hereford division, but was beaten out of the reserve championship by an Angus entry.

"Honeymoon" made Mr and Mrs. Secandino farm owners in Indiana by bringing \$30 a pound when sold Thursday. Paying the record price was Arthur Godfrey, radio and television star who was making personal appearances at the International Horse Show

The Secondinos were living with her parents.
