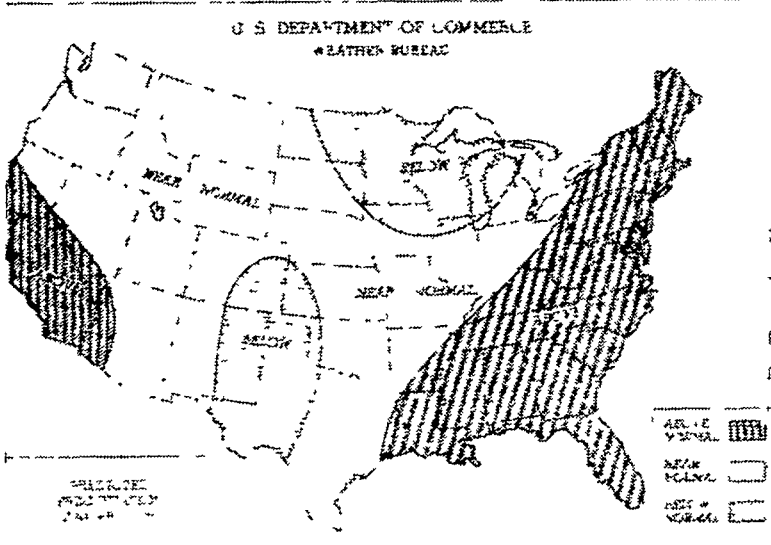
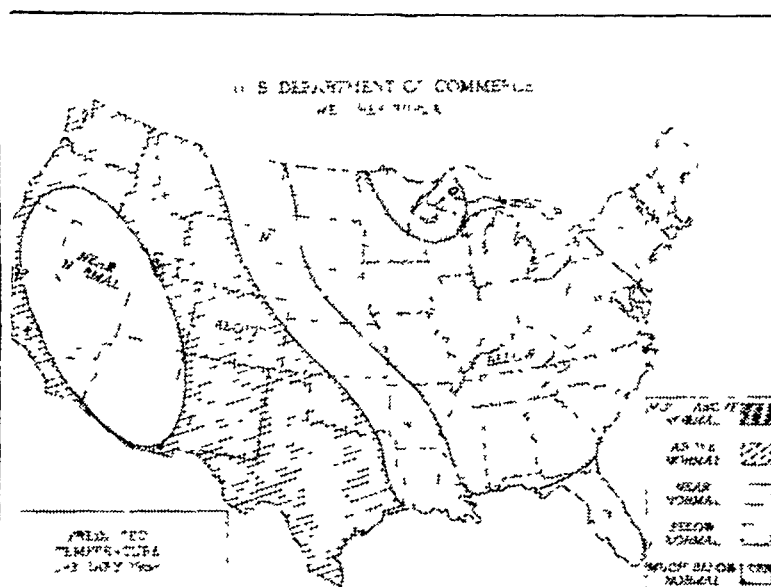

Too Many Horses Cause Congestion At Farm Show

Due to lack of housing facilities the Farm Show Commission faced a problem of "too many horses" A record number of 40 teams have been entered in the annual State Farm Show Championship horse pulling contest to be held during the week of January 13-17 1958

According to John B McCool Farm Show director it will be necessary to turn down some of the owners who want to bring 80 head of horses for the Wednesday night pulling tests, or move some beef cattle entries into tents outside the present temporary beef cattle and horse barn

Percheron and Belgian hoises entered in competition for Farm Show premium awards totaled 114 and this number already has been cut to 97, the number of stalls available for such horses

Use of the limited number of horse stalls at the Farm Show will be at capacity for the week, McCool pointed out The Pennsylvania State Police will need housing for their 50 horses to be used in their annual demonstration of horsemanship in the large arena on Monday night

When the State Police horses are moved out on Tuesday the horse pulling teams will be brought into the stalls - - as many of them that can be accommodated, the director said Their departure is scheduled for Thursday morning but the stalls again will be filled, this time with 4-H ponies and light horses to be used in riding demonstrations by boys and girls, a new Farm Show feature to be presented following the livestock cavalcade on Thursday night

Farm Show development plans for years have included a new beef cattle and horse barn to replace the sheet metal structure that has been in use since 1947 It is a former warehouse used by the United States Air Force during World War II when the Farm Show building was used for the reconditioning of airplane engines
