Cows mostly steady, stockers and feeders fully steady to strong. Receipts comprised around 40 per cent stockers and feeders and 12 per cent cows and bulls. Balance mainly good and choice slaughter steers except for about five loads of heifers. Bulk choice fed steers \$23 25 27 25, a few lots mixed high choice and prime \$27 50, two loads prime \$28 50. Bulk good grade steers \$23 00 24 75, some standard and low good \$22 00 23 00. Good and choice heifers \$21 50 25 25. Bulk utility and commercial cows by mid week \$16 00 16 00. Cutters mainly \$14 00 17 50, canners and low cutters \$12 00 13 75. Utility and commercial bulls \$19 50 22 50, good fed yearling bulls to \$23 50. Bulk medium and good stocker and feeder steers and light yearlings 590 1,000 lbs \$22 00 24 50, load 892 lb choice feeders \$25 00. Some common and medium stock steers \$19 00 21 50. Good and choice 450 575 lb stock steer calves \$24 00 27 00.

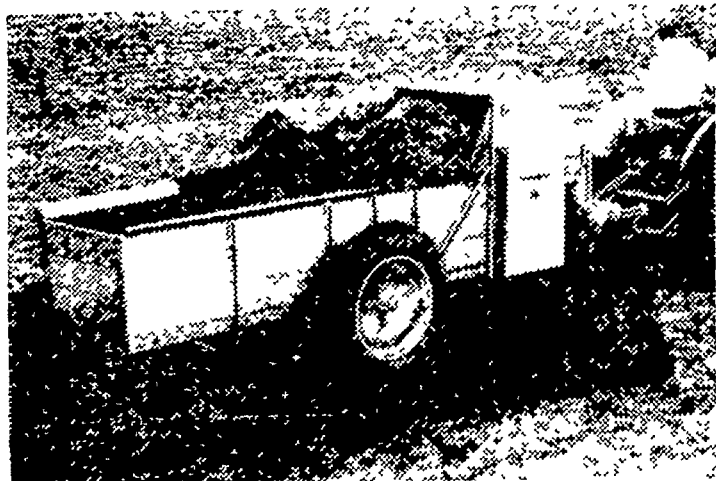

Broilers Command Best Prices Since August at Lancaster Exchange

LANCASTER, Jan. 9—Broilers hit the highest prices here since the last week of August when the average for 119,625 birds was 20 58 cents. The August sale average was 20 1/4 cents.

The 1957 high was a 23 cent average paid in the last week of July.

At the recent sale the range for broilers was from 20 to 22 1/2 cents. A lot of barred cross cockerels sold for 18 cents; a lot of 50 Muscovy ducks went for 25 cents and 7,140 capettes ranged from 21 1/4 to 25 1/4 cents.

A year ago the broiler average was 18 55 cents with 101,425 head being sold. Capettes averaged 21 1/4 cents.
