

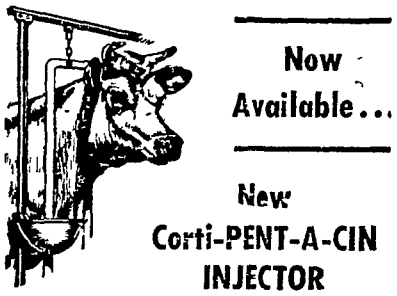

Active Trading Boosts Prices At Baltimore

BALTIMORE, Jan 13 — Around 6 per cent of today's receipts were slaughter steers with good and choice grades predominating. Heifers were in limited supply, cows made around 25 per cent of receipts. Trading was moderately active for steers, heifers and cows. Bulls moved slow. Prices for slaughter steers was fully steady, heifers steady, cows strong to 50 cents higher, bulls sold weak to 50 cents lower.
High—Good and Choice 950 1200 lb slaughter steers sold at \$25 00 \$26 50 with choice lots bringing \$26 00 \$27 00. A load mainly average hoice 1106 lb weights cleared at \$27 25. Numerous lots mostly good including some choice brought \$23 50 \$25 50, standard and good \$22 00 \$24 00. Good and choice heifers bulked from \$23 00 \$24 00. 6 head choice 810 lbs brought \$25 25. Cattle to commercial cows realized \$19 00 \$20 00 \$21 00 \$22 00 \$23 00 \$24 00. Bulk utility and commercial bulls brought \$20 50 \$21 50 few at \$22 00. An individual 2510 lb utility bull sold at \$22 50. Few sales stocker and feeder steers steady with good and choice feeders selling from \$22 00 \$24 00.
VEALERS AND CALVES Vealers steady with not enough slaughter calves on offer to establish a price trend. Good and choice vealers sold from \$32 00 \$36 00.
HOGS Bulk of the supplies were U S No 1 3, 180 240 lb Barrows and gilts with sows making around 5 per cent. Trading fairly active under a good demand. Prices for barrows and gilts

were mostly 25 cents higher with the limited number of sows also selling around 25 cents up. U S No 1 3 180-230 lb barrows and gilts sold from \$20 50 \$20 75 with the latter price paid freely. A few mostly No 1 and 2 grade butchers brought \$21 00. A lot No 2 and 3 averaging 274 lbs, sold at \$18 50. U S No 1 3, 300 400 lb sows brought \$16 00 \$16 75 with a few No 1 and 2 under 300 lbs selling up to \$17 25.
SHEEP AND LAMBS A 62 head lot good to mostly choice 91 lb woolled slaughter lambs sold fully 50 cents higher at \$24 50, 28 head mainly good 107 lb Buck lambs sold at \$23 00.
