

Broilers Continue High with Average 23.15 Cents at Lancaster Exchange

LANCASTER, Jan. 23 — The upswing in poultry prices continued here today at the Lancaster Poultry Exchange with the average being 23.15 cents for 167,675 broilers.

In a sale that totaled 173,025 birds, 75 males sold for 10 1/4 cents, 2,500 heavy fowl moved at 11 1/4 cents, 350 Leghorns, brought 15 1/4 cents, and 5,300 caplet birds sold from 24 1/4 to 25 cents.

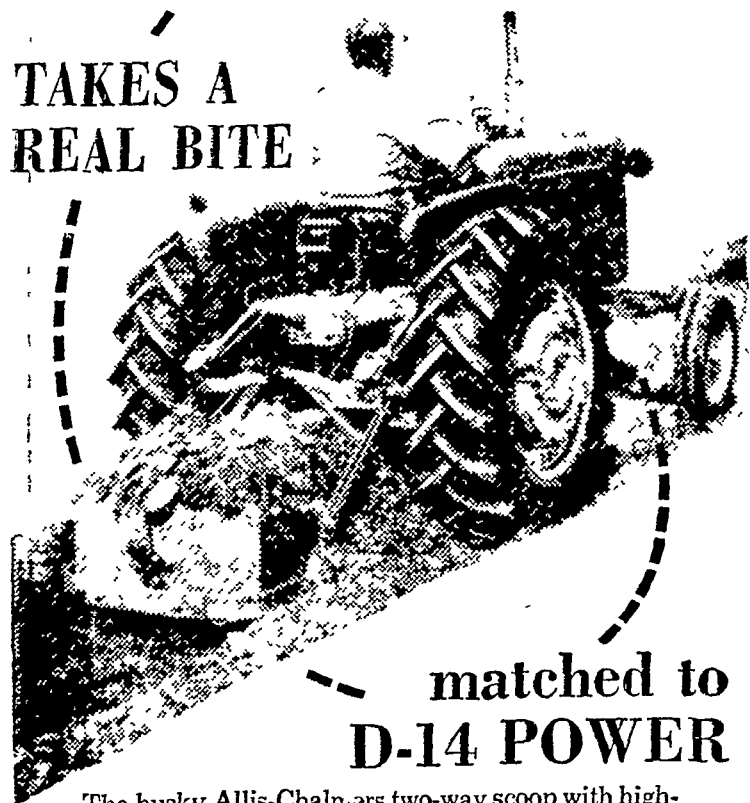

Steers Weaker, Stockers Lower At Chicago

CHICAGO, Jan. 28 (AMS) — Estimated salable receipts Cattle, 7,000; calves, 200, hogs, 8,000, and sheep, 1,500.

CATTLE: Steers good and better, weak to 50 cents lower, choice 900-1,050 pounds steady, utility and standard grade steers steady. Heifers 50 cents lower, average-choice and better steady, cows and bulls 25 cents higher; vealers steady, stockers and feeders 50 cents lower.

Prime 1,150-1,250 pound slaughter steers \$30-31.50, high choice and mixed choice and prime \$27.50-29.25, good to average choice \$22.50-27, part load prime 950 pound heifers \$28.50, load high choice 1,100 pound mixed steers and heifers \$27.50. Good and choice heifers \$22.27-25; standard cows \$18-19.50, utility and commercial \$15.75-17.50. Canners and cutters, \$13-16. Utility and commercial bulls \$18.50-20.75. Good and choice vealers \$27-32, standard grades \$21-26, cull and utility \$12-20.

HOGS: Steady to 25 cents higher on barrows and gilts; sows scarce, 25 cents higher. Weights of 190-230 pounds, \$19.65-20, several lots of these weights \$20.15-20.25 with around 200 head at \$20.25. Two hundred forty to 260 pounders at \$19.25-19.65, 270-290 pounds, \$18.75-19.25, 400-525 pound sows, \$17-17.75, 340-380 pounds, \$17.75-18.

Cattle, Hog Prices Weak; Vealers Reach \$40 at Lancaster Market

LANCASTER, Jan. 29. — Wednesday to Wednesday review.

CATTLE: Three days 3,800, week ago, 3,502. Demand rather poor for slaughter steers this week and prices 50 cents to \$1.00 lower than last Wednesday, heifers, weak to 50 cents lower. Cows in good demand, fully steady, bulls also fully steady. Stockers and feeders moderately active early, slower by Wednesday in sympathy with low prices of fed cattle and about steady with last Wednesday.

Early in the week choice fed steers 1,000-1,300 lbs. \$21.50-27.25, a few loads and lots high choice and mixed choice and prime \$27.50-28.75, load mostly prime 1,259 lb steers \$29.75, load 1,143 lb prime steers \$30.25. Good and low choice steers \$23.75-25.25, a few good grade 1,000 lb steers on Tuesday at \$23.25. Some mixed standard and low good \$22-23.25.

Small lots good and low choice slaughter heifers \$21.50-24.50, small lot 945 lb high choice \$26.25. Bulk cutter and utility cows \$14.25-17.50, a few high utility and commercial cows \$17.75-18.50, standard grade cows to \$19.50. Canners and low cutters \$12.25-14. Utility and commercial bulls \$20-22.50, good fed yearling bulls to \$24.

Bulk medium and good stocker and feeder steers and light year-

lings 610-1,050 lbs. \$22.50-25, a couple loads 1,000-1,050 lb good and choice feeding steers \$25.50-25.75, one load 816 lb choice feeding steers \$26.50. Part load 1,225 lb partly fattened steers grading good from a slaughter standpoint \$24.85 for further feeding. A few lots 450-570 lb. stock steer calves and light yearlings good and choice \$25-28, six head 611 lb. choice short yearlings \$28.65.

CALVES: 727-week ago 632. Vealers moderately active fully steady with last Wednesday. Bulk good and choice vealers 140-210 lbs \$28.50-34, high choice and prime \$34.50-39, odd head reached \$40 Monday. Standard grade vealers \$22.50-28, utility down to \$17.

HOGS: 1,434, week ago 1,563. Barrows and gilts 50-75 cents lower than last Wednesday, sows scarce, about steady. Bulk barrows and gilts mixed U S 1-3, 190-230 lbs in Wednesday's trade \$20.50-21, a few No 1 and 2, 21.50-22, some sales No. 3 back to \$20.25. A few 230-260 lbs. No. 2 and 3, \$20.20-50. Sows mixed U S 1, 2 and 3 300 lbs and heavier \$14-17.50, a few under 300 lbs to \$18.

SHEEP: 196, week ago 187. Slaughter lambs fully steady. Bulk good and low choice wooled slaughter lambs \$22.50-26, knds grading average choice and better scarce. A few utility and low good \$19.50-22.50.
