Egg Questions

dozen The average weight of the dozen must be at least 24 ounces. No eggs may weigh less than at the rate of 23 ounces a dozen. (The weights used for individual eggs are expressed at the rate per dozen.)

Q Can 1 pack 28 ounce eggs in a carton marked large?

A Yes, the weight for each size grade is a minimum weight and not maximum.

Q Are dirty eggs permitted in cartons marked grade AA, A, B or C?

A No. Grade AA, A, B, and C

eggs must be free from adhering dirt.

What other markings?

Q Can other markings, such as white, brown, etc., be marked on the carton?

A. Such markings can be placed on the carton along with the required markings.

Q. I have a large proportion of my cartons returned. May I reuse these cartons?

A. The cartons can be reused. They would have your name and address on. You will need to be careful that the eggs packed in the carton are of the same grade and size as marked on the carton.

Q What is the tolerance for

quality?

A. Two eggs may be in the quality grade immediately below that marked on the carton.

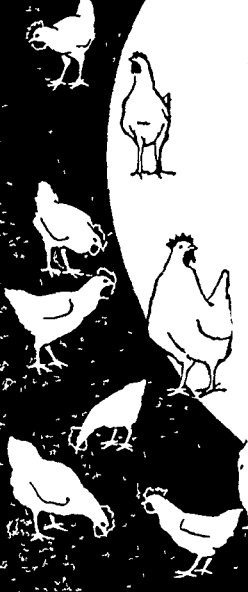
Q Are blood spots permitted in candled eggs?

A. Blood spots are not permitted in Grade AA and A. Blood spots less than an eighth of an inch in diameter are permitted in Grade C eggs. In Grade B eggs the tolerance of two eggs which could be Grade C in quality may have blood spots which are less than an eighth of an inch in diameter.

Q If I deliver eggs in baskets to the consumer at her home and put them in her container, such as a dish or pan, do I have to do any marking?

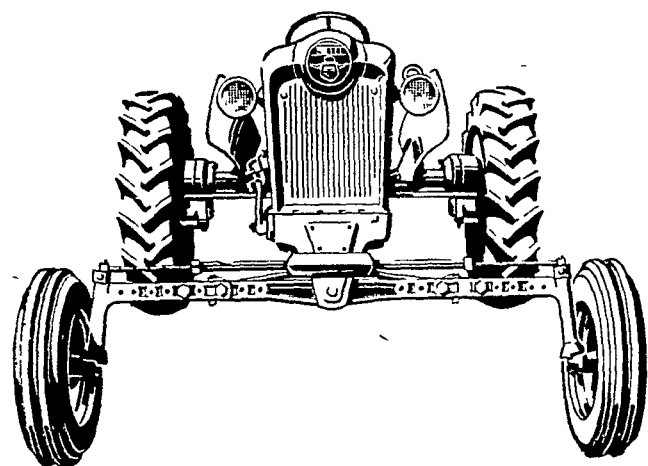
A. No, only eggs packed and marketed in cartons must be marked.
