

Cassel, Lapp Win Top Honors in Beef, Lamb Club

Marlin Cassel, R1 Manheim, and J David Lapp, R1 Bareville, shared honors at the Red Rose Baby Beef and Lamb Club Banquet Friday night.

Cassel was named county champion in the beef division and Lapp had the county and state champion lambs.

Both received trophies and Cassel a gold watch.

County agent Max Smith too received a watch for his work with the club. However, his was one of the new electric types.

Speaker at the dinner, held at the Armstrong Cork Co. Auditorium in Lancaster, was Dr. Allen S. Meck, president emeritus of the Theological Seminary of the Evangelical and Reformed Church, Lancaster.

Speaking on the topic of "Tips for Tip-Top Boys, Girls, and Parents," he said that young people must be ambitious to learn to do one thing well. "If you are going to be a farmer, you should plan to be the best farmer in Lancaster County."

He also warned both the youths and their parents to live so that they will not throw the ashes of a misspent life into God's face.

Nancy Rohrer, R3 Lititz, received the trophy as reserve county champion in the beef club. The Southeast district reserve champion's cup went to Miss Dorothy Groff, R1 Strasburg.

Fred Bernard, R2 Mt Joy got a trophy for showing the reserve champion at the first Pennsylvania Livestock Exposition.

For having junior champion Shorthorn and reserve champion Shorthorn at the Farm Show, Miss Marian Hackman, R3 Elizabethtown, received a trophy.

Two trophies were given the members whose animals showed the highest daily gain. First was Miss Doris Shenk, R3 Manheim, whose Hereford steer gained 2.34 pounds a day. Another Hereford, this one owned by Fred Linton Jr., Quarryville, gained 2.27 pounds a day to take second place.

Miss Leona Augsburger, R1 Reinholds, had the highest project score for the year. Second to her was Miss Nancy Gible, R3 Elizabethtown. Miss Augsburger's score was 99.3 while Miss Gible posted a 98.9 point score.

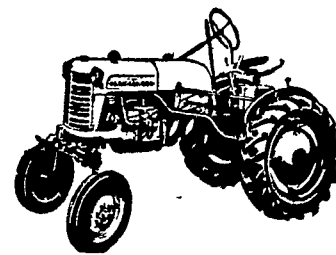
