All through the South rice Spoon Bread or Batter Bread is a favorite. If you've never eaten it you're in for a real treat. It's puffy and brown on top like a souffle. It is perfect as a bread for any meal and makes a main dish served with bacon or sausage. Eat it with butter and many people like hot maple or brown sugar syrup over it.

CAROLINA BATTER BREAD (SPOON BREAD)

3/4 cup uncooked white rice
1 1/2 cups water
1 1/2 teaspoons salt
2 1/2 cups milk
1/2 cup yellow or white corn meal
3 tablespoons butter or margarine

3 eggs separated.
Cook rice. Stir the milk and corn meal into the rice. Cook over a medium heat, stirring until the milk is absorbed and the mixture thickens. Add the butter or margarine. Cool slightly. Beat the egg yolks. Stir the egg yolks into the rice mixture. Beat the egg whites until stiff but not dry. Fold into the rice mixture. Place in a greased two-quart baking dish. Bake in a pre-heated 400 degree oven about 40 minutes or until a knife inserted in the center comes out clean. The top will be very brown. Lower heat if top becomes too brown before mixture is done in the center. Serve immediately with butter or margarine. Hot maple or brown sugar syrup is delicious, too. This recipe makes eight servings.

A different way to serve shrimp

EMERALD RING WITH CURRIED SHRIMP

2 cups water

1 teaspoon salt
1 cup uncooked white rice
1 cup finely chopped cooked spinach, drained (10-ounce package, frozen)
2 tablespoons grated onion
1/8 teaspoon black pepper
1/4 teaspoon chili powder
1/4 cup butter or margarine (one-half stick)

Cook rice. Salt spinach to taste. Stir in rice, onions, black pepper, chili powder and butter or margarine. Press into a well greased ring mold. Use as large a mold as possible. Serve immediately or make ahead of time and about 40 minutes before serving, place mold in a skillet of hot water. Heat until hot through. If desired, spoon rice-spinach mixture into a ring on serving plate instead of molding.

SAUCE

About 1 1/2 teaspoons curry powder
About 3/4 cup water
2 cans (10 1/2 oz.) condensed cream of celery soup

About 14 oz. shelled, deveined shrimp, raw or cooked.
To make shrimp sauce, mix curry powder, water and soup in a saucepan. Add shrimp. Heat 20 minutes or until shrimp turns pink or is very hot. Taste. Add more curry powder if desired. Add water for a thinner sauce.
To serve, unmold the rice-spinach ring on a large platter. Fill center and surround outside with shrimp mixture. A small bowl may be placed in center of ring to hold sauce if sauce is very thin. This recipe makes six servings.

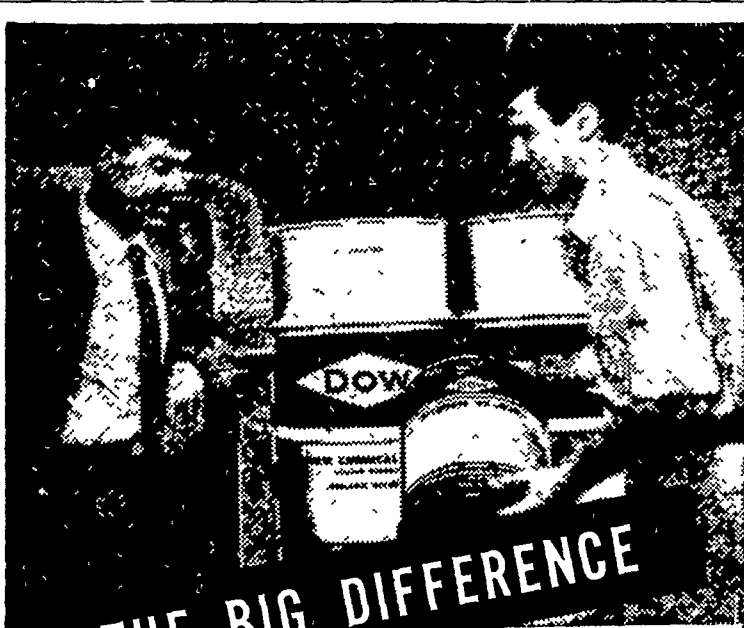
