Farm People Like Trees for Shade, Not to Increase Property Value

Among farm people the value of trees and shrubs for shade is more important thin increased property value, according to a statewide survey of lanscaping among homeowners. This report was made at the recent nurserymen's conference at the Fennsylvaria State University

J E Kıvlın, graduate assıstant in the Devartment of Agricultural Economics and Rural Sociology at Penn State said 40 per cent of the people sampled listed the shade value of trees and shrubs as one of the most important reaors for landscaping

Pinkshipper ripens in season with Maiglobe First fruits are usually ready for picking about 75 day- after transplanting mediumsized plants, but in warm weather they may ripen in 65 days. The fist haivest may be small, but growers who have tested Pinkshipper feel it will give a high pricentage of marketable fruit throughout the growing season




