Broiler Price Drop Lowers Ratio To 4.2; Demand Generally Weak

Federal-State Market News

PHILADELPHIA — With the average price for broilers dropping to 20 66 cents a pound from the 21 17 cents average a week ago, the broiler ratio took a two point drop to 4.2

Feed prices remained nearly steady, with a drop of 4 cents a ton for 20 per cent broiler mash being reported

In the major broiler producing areas, the demand was slack and there was a general easing of prices at the beginning of the week The Eastern Shore Poultry Growers Exchange in the Delmarva area reported that most sales were at the 19 5 to 19 9 cent range at the April 4 sale

Here are prices being paid at the beginning of the week in the major broiler producing areas of the nation:

DELMARVA Market quiet Trading very light and mostly at undetermined prices Too few sales to report prices

NORTH GEORGIA: Offering prices mostly a cent lower Demand continues irregular, but a trace more confident and a slight improvement noted in some instances Offerings adequate to fully ample Of 642,900 head sold, most went at 19 cents with about a fifth at 18 cents

NORTH CAROLINA: Supplies adequate Demand fair Prices paid for 459,000 head was 18 cents with 12 per cent of the sales undetermined.

SHENANDOAH VALLEY: Supply about adequate for fair to good demand Sentiment divided resulting in heavy volume reported at undetermined. Heavy hens scarce With about half the prices undetermined, the bulk of the sales were at 19 cents. Heavy hens brought 22 to 23 cents

ARKANSAS: Offerings and supplies ranged adequate to slightly short of needs for a good demand Prices paid for 2¼ to 3½ pound birds were mostly 18 cents, with prices for 40 per cent of the volume undetermined.

ALABAMA: Offerings and supplies ample to fully ample Demand con-

tinues only fair in most instances Farm prices were 18-18½ cents, with fully 85 per cent of the birds moving at that price Some 48,000 birds brought 19 cents at the plant

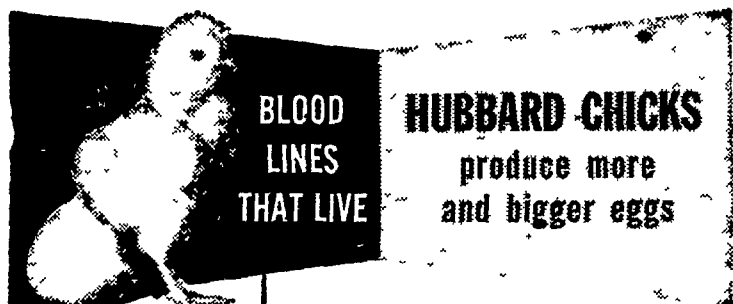

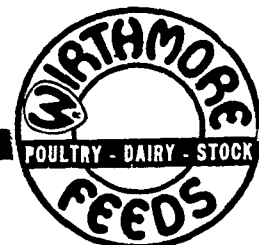
