Broiler Prices Continue Steady With Offerings Heavy in East

Federal-State Market News
PHILADELPHIA April 15 — Broiler chicken prices continued steady at the beginning of the week with a fairly active demand taking heavy offerings in the East.

Broiler ratio slipped down an other three points this week and now stands at 3.9. The price quoted for 20 per cent broiler ration was \$99 34 a ton, up \$124 from a week ago. This combined with a drop of 1 63 cents a pound for live broilers to give the ratio an unfavorable aspect.

A year ago lower feed prices had the ratio two points higher despite a 19.24 cent price for broilers.

Here is the way the broiler market looked around the country on Tuesday.

DELMARVA: Market quiet. Trading light and mostly at prices to be determined later. Too few sales to report prices. In Monday's trading the bulk of the birds went at 19 to 19½ cents with a top at 20 cents.

NORTH GEORGIA: Trading continues heavy under fairly active demand. Offerings clearing readily and generally adequate, however, slightly short of immediate needs at an occasional point. Bulk of the sales were at 18-18½ cents with 19 cents being given for birds delivered to dressing plants.

NORTH CAROLINA: Offerings adequate.

quate in some areas, short in others. Demand fair to good. Prices were steady at 18 cents with 537,700 head being sold.

SHENANDOAH VALLEY: Offerings fairly well balanced with needs. Trading fairly active for fair to good demand. Prices were mostly 18 cents with some birds at 18½ to 19 cents.

ARKANSAS: Offerings generally short of good demand. Some reported holding. More than half the birds sold were at 18 cents, with a few sales at 18½ and 19 cents.

ALABAMA: Trading active for good demand. Offerings and supplies generally ample for present needs; few instances offerings slightly short. Eighty-nine per cent of the sales were at 18 cents.
