

Slaughter Cattle Weaker, Stockers Steady at Lancaster Stockyards

LANCASTER, April 30 — CATTLE Three days 2889, week ago 3897 Slaughter steers and heifers unevenly steady to 50 cents lower than last Wednesday, cows 25 50 cents higher bulls fully steady Stockers and feeders fully steady with last Wednesday

Receipts comprised around 37 loads slaughter steers grading mostly good and choice About 40 per cent was stocked and feeder steers and yearlings and 20 per cent cows and bulls Bulk of the slaughter steers sold on Monday and trading that day extremely slow

Broilers Gain Cent and Half in Price At Lancaster Exchange Thursday

LANCASTER, April 24 — Broilers gained almost a cent and a half in price from a week ago and 24 cents from the corresponding date last year at the Lancaster Poultry Exchange today

A total of 82,725 broilers were sold A lot of 4,000 heavy broilers brought 23 1/2 cents, a lot of 250 Leghorn fowl brought 16 1/2 cents, but four lots of capettes found the market down to 26 1/4 to 28 cents

The range for broilers was from 20 to 22 1/2 cents The average was 21 48 cents

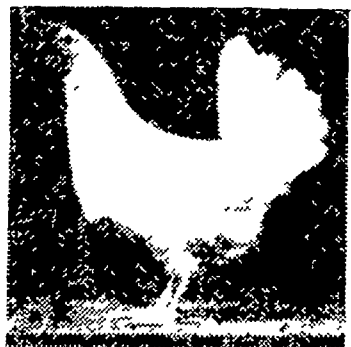

Does Spring Make You Careless About Little Things?

Sometimes folks get a little careless about caring for their birds They don't mean to, of course and it's most apt to happen at this time of year — when there are crops to put in gardens to plant or other spring chores



Here are a few things you might want to check again

Roosts—Have you got them up early enough for young birds and are there enough of them for older birds? Having enough is one way to prevent respiratory troubles

Floor Space—Is there enough floor space for your growing birds? When they reach 8 weeks of age floor space should be increased from 1 sq ft to 2 sq ft per bird

Vaccination—Are you up-to-date on a planned program of disease prevention for such things as Newcastle, bronchitis, and fowlpox? For Birds on Range

Clean Waterers—Birds on range should have waterers cleaned every day—the same as birds in houses

Fresh Grass—Green grass is excellent for growing pullets, but it should be kept clipped—not allowed to become dry, long and stringy

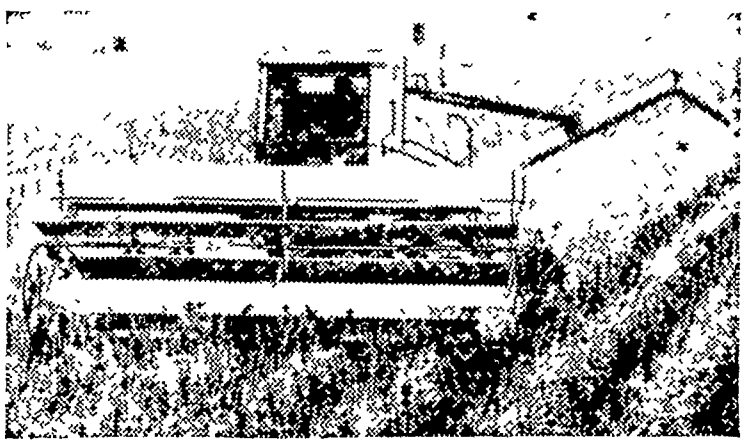
