**Broiler Market Generally Firm; Broiler-Feed Ratio Drops to 3.8**

PHILADELPHIA, April 30 — The broiler market was generally steady to firm with numerous reports of short supplies throughout the nation at the beginning of the week.

In the Delmarva area, the demand was light. Prices tended to range slightly higher with most sales in excess of 20½ cents.

The broiler-feed ratio, however, is now down to 3.8 for the last week. Feed prices at \$103.94 a ton for 20 per cent broiler ration combined with an average price of 19.71 cents to drop the figure. A year ago the ratio stood at an even 4.0.

However, the figure is up one point from one week ago.

Here is the state of the broiler market in the major poultry producing areas on Tuesday morning.

**DELMARVA** Market quiet. Trading light. Offerings less than normal. Demand fair. Prices mostly unchanged. Of 113,800 head reported sold 31 per cent were at 20.50 cents, 17 per cent at 20.75, 1 per cent at 20.00 and 39 per cent undetermined.

**NORTH GEORGIA** Demand good and offerings in fair balance with need. Some points are short. Most sales were at 19 cents with a few at 19½ cents.

**NORTH CAROLINA** Offerings adequate to short demand. Good price at the farm were from 19 to 20½ with most sales at 19 cents.

**SHEPHERD VALLEY** Offerings about adequate in some instances to short of needs in others. Demand fair to good. Price ranged from 19 to 21 cents with only 11 per cent at the latter price.

**ARKANSAS** Offerings short of needs at most points, barely adequate.

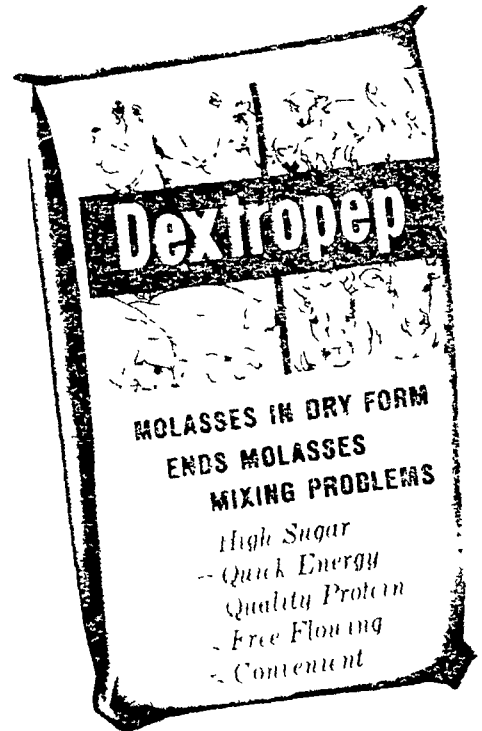
