**Broiler Market Generally Steady In Most Areas at First of Week**

PHILADELPHIA, May 6 — A generally steady broiler market prevailed across the nation at the beginning of the week with only a few areas reporting a shortage of offerings  
Demand was good and prices reflected the strength of the market  
In the Delmarva area trading was quiet Monday with only 147,000 head being sold Prices were from 2.50 to 21.80 with most sales at 21.50 and 21.75.  
DELMARVA Market tone steady trading light and mostly at undetermined prices A few lots move due to storm damage Prices were from 21 to 22 cents One lot of small type turkey fryers sold for 28 cents a pound  
GEORGIA Offerings were fairly well balanced with needs at most points, but the range was from ample to short of needs in some instances Demand generally good Volume at lower offerings prices very light and reflect price resistance in extreme

Buyers offering prices at the farm were from 19 to 20 cents, mostly 20 cents  
NORTH CAROLINA Offerings adequate Demand generally good Prices were from 20 to 21 cents, with fully 97 per cent of the sales at 20 cents  
SHENANDOAH VALLEY Offerings were fairly well balanced with needs at most points Demand good Prices were from 20 to 20.75 cents Most moved at 21 cents  
ARKANSAS Offerings ranged from short to adequate Demand fair to good Prices paid were 20 cents for 38 per cent of the birds, 21 cents for two per cent and the rest of the sale prices were undetermined  
ALABAMA Demand generally good Offerings and supplies adequate and fairly well in balance with present needs Prices were from 19.50 to 20 cents Most sales were at 20 cents

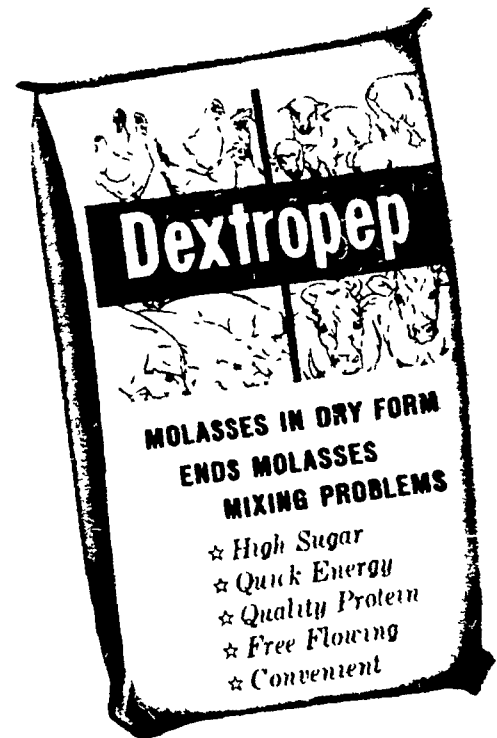
