## Type 41 Tobacco Stocks Decline 16 Per Cent From April 1, 1957

Stocks of Type 41 tobacco as of April 1 were down 24 million pounds from the same date last year, based on the quarterly reports of dealers and manufacturers.

This is a decrease of about 16 per cent.

Puerto Rican filler stocks, however, showed a three million pound increase from a year ago. Including tobacco held on the Island, there are 57,311,000 pounds of Puerto Rican being held.

THE TOBACCO industry as a whole showed less stock on hand with an increase being made in only two categories.

Domestic wrapper was up by nine per cent, and stocks of foreign grown cigarette leaf continued their climb and now stand at a record high level.

FLUE - CURED stocks were down seven per cent, the most

significant decrease volume-wise. Other kinds showing a decrease were fire-cured (down seven per cent), dark air-cured (down nine per cent) and cigar binder (down 13 per cent).

For the nation as a whole, there was a decrease of 201 million pounds compared with a year earlier.

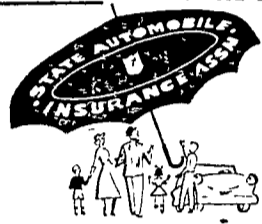
There were 1,116 million pounds of leaf under government loan as of April 1.

## 26.9 Billion Pounds Of Red Meat Produced

A total of 26.9 billion pounds of red meat were produced in 1957, according to recent figures of the Crop Reporting Board. This is four per cent less than the all-time high set in 1956, and above any other year of record.

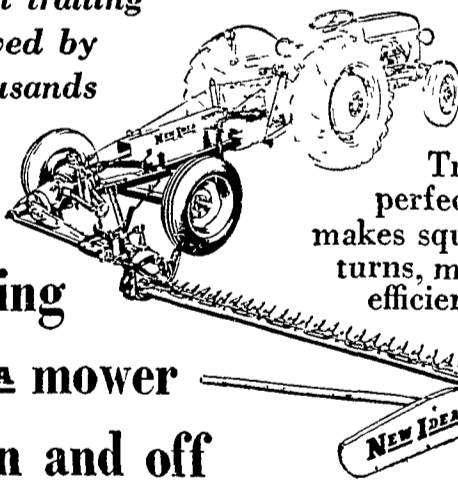
