

## Broilers Average 19.76 Cents At Lancaster Exchange Thursday

LANCASTER, July 17 — Broilers sold for an average price about four cents a pound under the average for the corresponding sale last year at the Lancaster Poultry Exchange. A total of 135,150 birds averaged 19.75 cents a pound.

This price was still above the Delmarva price where the average was about 19.1 cents a pound.

The range at Lancaster was from 18 3/4 cents to 20 1/2 cents a pound. Less than one per cent sold for 18 3/4 cents, 12 per cent at 19 cents, four per cent at 19 1/4 cents, two per cent at 19 1/2 cents, 38 per cent at 19 3/4 cents, 35 per cent at 20 cents, six per cent at 20 1/4 cents, and three per cent at 20 1/2 cents.

Also sold were eight lots, 8,100 head, of capettes for 24 to 28 1/2 cents, a 350 head lot of heavy hens at 18 cents, 1,240 head of White Rock hens from 19 1/4 and 20 cents, 95 head of light hens at 15 and 16 cents and 170 head of New Hampshire caponette cockles at 15 cents a pound.

Unsold were 46,875 head of broilers in 11 lots, 3,000 head of capettes in two lots, and a 1,200 head lot of light hens.

## Light Run of Cattle Finds Market Uneven at Lancaster Stockyards

LANCASTER, July 23 — CATTLE: Three days 2,050 compared 3,100 last week. Receipts near 63 loads slaughter steers, very few slaughter heifers, approximately 15 per cent stockers and feeders, the balance cows and bulls in about equal proportions. Trading slow.

Slaughter steers uneven, choice and prime over 1.100 lb steady to 25 cents, instances 50 cents lower. Average choice and below under 1.100 lb steady to 25 cents higher. Few slaughter heifers about steady. Cows steady to 25 cents higher, bulls, stockers and feeders steady.

Four loads high choice to average prime 1,050, 1,362 lb fed steers \$29.25-29.50, including load mostly prime 1,230 lb fed steers \$29.25, 75 cents under feedlot mates week earlier. Bulk choice 700-1,100 lb \$26.75-28.75, choice 1,100-1,300 lb \$27-28, good 700-1,100 lb \$25.25-27.25, standard \$23.50-25.25, commercial \$22-23.50. Load good and low choice 835 lb fed heifers \$27. Commercial cows \$20.50-21.75, utility \$17.75-20.50, canner and cutter to \$15.

\$15-20.50, late mainly \$15.25 up. Most good 850-1,100 lb fed bulls \$26.50-27.50, commercial \$23.50-25.50, utility \$22.50-23.50, cutter \$20-23. Few lightweight canner bulls down to \$16.

Small lot choice 414 lb stock steers \$28. Majority choice 500-1,050 lb stockers and feeders \$27-30, good \$25.25-27, medium \$23.50-25.25, common \$20-23.

CALVES: Three days 587 compared 524 last week. Active, usually not enough receipts to fill demand, closing \$1 to \$2 higher than week ago. Prime \$32-34, choice \$29-33, good \$26-30, standard \$23-28.

HOGS: Three days 1,321 compared 1,453 last week. Active, fully steady. Bulk of receipts mixed U.S. 1-3, 190-230 lb barrows and gilts \$24-24.50, No 1 and 2, 190-230 lb \$24.25-24.50, some \$25, No 2 and 3, 230-270 lb \$23.50-24. Mixed grade 300-550 lb sows \$16-20, mainly \$19.75 down.

SHEEP: 517 compared 539 last week. Moderately active, steady. Bulk choice 70-90 lb spring lambs \$23.50-25, good \$22-24, some \$25.50-27, utility medium \$18-20, few culls down to \$15.




