

LOADING SILAGE for a trench will be an easier task, according to builders of this "Bef" Ensiloader. The digging reel is hydraulically raised to clear the top of the silage pile. As the reel revolves, its auto-

matically feeds itself into the silage and cuts away. The silage is thrown into the hopper and the conveyor belt delivers it to the vehicle being loaded.

Bayer 21/199, Systemic Insecticide Given Government Recommendation

The U S Department of Agriculture now recommends the use of Bayer 21/199, commercially available as CO-RAL, for control of certain livestock pests, it was announced today. Chemical name of the active ingredient is O-(3-chloro-4-methylumbelliferone) O-diethylphosphorothioate.

This material has been accepted for registration under pesticide regulation laws. It may be used with proper precautions on beef cattle for the control of cattle grubs, horn flies, lice, ticks, keds, and screwworms, and on swine for the control of lice and screwworms.

The new USDA recommendation, issued as a supplement to Agriculture Handbook No. 120, published in February, adds Bayer 21/199 to several materials recommended for control of these

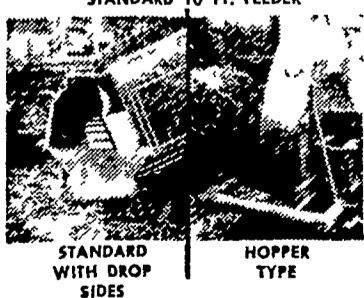
pests.

Bayer 21/199 should not be applied to sick animals or calves less than three months of age. Sixty

days must intervene between the last application and slaughter. It is not recommended for use on dairy cattle or milk goats, since it is known to secrete in the milk for a week or 10 days following treatments. As with other insecticides, no tolerance has been established in milk.
