300 Holstein Breeders Attend Field Day; Metzler Wins Contest

Some 300 Lancaster County dairymen and their families gathered Friday at the farm of Le Roy K Andrews, R7 Lancaster, to judge Holsteins, hear the latest news of the breed and hear GOP gubernatorial candidate Arthur T. McGonigle speak.

The event was the annual field day of the Lancaster County Holstein breeders Assn.

There were 132 entries in the morning dairy animal judging contest.

Winning first place in the youth division was Ned Paes, R1 Strasburg. First in the ladies division

was Mrs Melvin Peifer, R1 Willow Street and John C. Metzler, R1, Christiana was first in the mens division.

RUNNERS-UP IN the youth contest were George Rutt Jr., R1 Stevens, and J. Robert Hummer, R1 Manheim. In the ladies divisions, Mrs Parke Ranck, R1 Ronks, and Mrs. Ernest Mellingier, R1 Ronks, placed second and third.

Ira Welk, R1 Strasburg, and Eugene Groff, R1 Strasburg, placed below Metzler in the mens division.

Mrs. Peifer was presented a silver tray, Paes a halter and small cup, and Metzler received the Eshleman Trophy for a year. The rotating Eshleman Trophy must be won twice for permanent possession.

William Cunningham, a director of the state Holstein organization, told the audience that at-

tendance has been lacking at the State Black and White Show. He said that many times there are few spectators attending that are not also exhibitors.

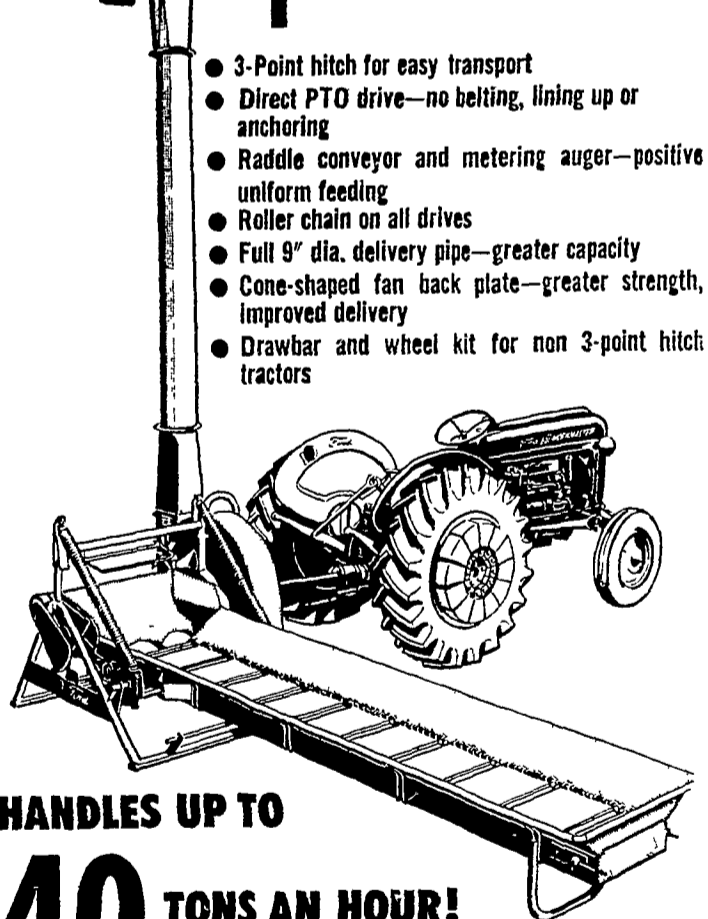
