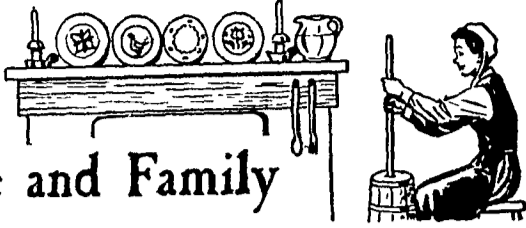

Dress Properly At Plow Match Specialist Says

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. — If you are one of the many thousands who will be attending the National Plowing Contest and Conservation exhibition on Aug. 21 and 22 at Hershey dress appropriately to get the most pleasure from the occasion.

The weather may be hot or on the cool side, rainy or dry and dusty. Regardless of the weather, Mae B. Barton, clothing specialist, the Pennsylvania State Uni-

versity, has a suggestion that could help you to enjoy the event. Wear comfortable clothes!

In addition to the throngs who will be at the big national event, other thousands of spectators will be out for the preliminary matches in Pennsylvania, including the state finals August 19, also at Hershey. Meanwhile there also will be the four regional eliminations in the state, and some of the thirty-six county contests that are to be held this week.

Spectators, Mrs. Barton says, will do a lot of walking — all day and on uneven ground, and could develop blisters, or worse, from new or unsuited shoes. She suggests comfortable shoes that can be restored easily from dust or mud. High heels she adds, had better be left in the car.

Equally important are appropriate hats — broad brim straws for women, visored caps or hats for the men, and some protective headgear for the teenagers, too. Hats, Mrs. Barton reminds, afford protection against sunstroke. "Be sure your head is covered when standing or walking in the sun."

As to clothing, the wash and wear fabrics get the nod. They're comfortable, durable, and require little care in laundering. Also, they stay fresh looking and wrinkle free. Take along sweaters, jackets or coats for unexpected cool spells. Also, umbrellas, raincoats, even overshoes could be appreciated if needed.

Poultry Group To Feed 150,000 At Plow Contest

Have you ever fed 150,000 people? That's the job undertaken by the Pennsylvania Poultry Federation at their 8th Annual Poultry Festival to be held in Hershey, Pennsylvania, August 21 through 24, during Pennsylvania Dutch Days and in conjunction with the National Plowing Contest. The expected crowd of 150,000 persons attending the four days will require enough chicken to extend one mile longer than the Golden Gate Bridge.

Twenty-seven and one-half tons of chickens reaching six miles will be barbecued at a record pace of 2,250 halves every hour on five 48 foot barbecue pits. To accomplish this 560 volunteers will work 4,000 hours within a 52 hour barbecuing period. In all, 50,000 halves of chickens will be barbecued.

The condiments necessary to barbecue the chickens include 300 gallons of vinegar and 700 pounds of butter. One thousand dozen rolls per day will be used for the chicken dinner and 200 pound loaves of bread will be used in sandwiches. In addition, the Festival Committee ordered 30,000 butter patties, 200 gallons of egg nog, 200 gallons of chicken corn soup, 450 dozens of pickled eggs and 400 dozens of five cent bags of potato chips.

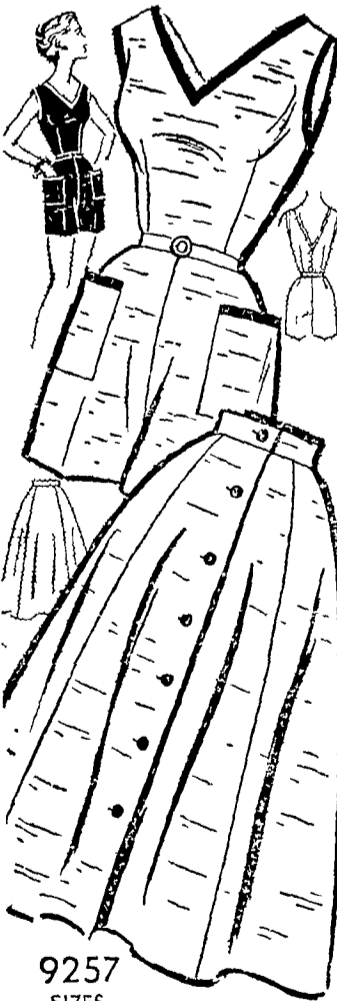

Penna. Flying Farmers Hosts At Plow Match

Pennsylvania Flying Farmers have accepted the responsibility of acting as host for those who fly to the National Plowing Contest at Hershey, Pennsylvania, August 19, 20, 21, & 22. Doughnuts and coffee will be served by the Pennsylvania Flying Farmers and will be contributed by International Harvester Company.

Arrangements have been made by C.A.A. to have those flying into Hershey to tune in on radio frequency 122.8 for instruction. The pilot is not to call the airport but plan the normal landing pattern, but listen for landing instruction. This method will expedite more rapid movement of the smaller aircraft.

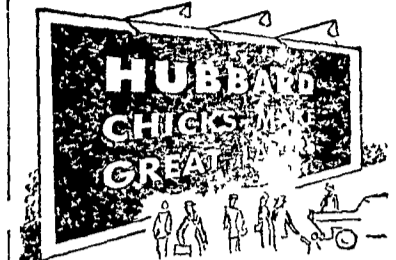
