

Lancaster County 4-H Dairymen Compete For Show Honors

Youthful dairymen from Lancaster County vied for honors in the 4-H Dairy Club show on Friday, August 8, held in conjunction with the Southeastern Pennsylvania Black and White Show. Competition was strong in all three divisions of the show.

Fitting honors went to Carol Ann Krantz, New Providence, who won the grand champion rosette after being named fitting champ in the Ayrshire breed. E. Bruce Boyd Ephrata R1 was top show man of the event with wins in Holstein showmanship class and in the grand championship showmanship class.

The fitting title for the other breeds were as follows: Jersey — Phyllis Landis, Oak View Rd Lancaster; Guernsey — Glenn Bushong, Columbia R2, who went on the win reserve championship in fitting; Holstein — Sandra Rutt, Stevens R1.

Reserve honors in showing went to Joan Paes, Strasburg R1, tapped earlier for honors in Ayrshire showmanship. Other showmanship honors were awarded as follows: Jersey — J. Paul Herr, Holtwood R1; Guernsey — Kenneth Garber, Willow Street R2.

Robert Mumma, Landisville, garnered three first places in Guernsey breed competition before going on to take both reserve

and grand championship awards. The Junior Yearling, Har-Len K Jean, won over Har-Lan A. 'Ma mie, a two year old, and Har-Len A. Joy, a Junior Calf, both owned by the 16 yr. old dairyman.

In addition to the Jersey showmanship award, J. Paul Herr, collected breed honors with a two year old heifer named Emblem Thunder Betsy Design.

The senior yearling, Sesqua Manor Star Della, won the Holstein crown for her owner, J. Glenn Hess, Washington Boro R1.

Ralph E. Harnish II, Christiana R1, showed the senior calf, Glenhurst, Dixie Pretty, to the championship of the Ayrshire breed.

The judge of the show, held on the ground of the SPABC, was Harry Poorbaugh, Assistant Director of Extension at The Pennsylvania State University. Show manager was Leroy Welk Hayes Hastings was ring marshal, and Bill Nockols was in charge of announcing.

Cattle selected for the 14 county district 4-H Dairy Club roundup will compete in the Guernsey Sales Pavilion, Lincoln Highway East, on August 28. Winners at the district show will be eligible to compete in the state finals.

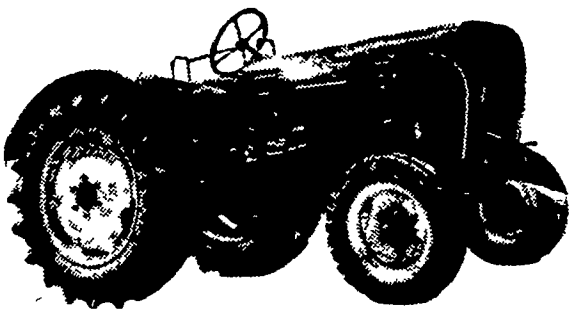

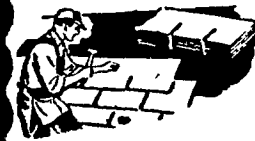

135,000 Fewer Calves in 1958

The 1958 calf crop is expected to total 40,872,000 head which compares with 41,007,000 calves

born in 1957, according to the Crop Reporting Board.

This is four per cent below the 1954 record crop of 42,610,000 head and is the fourth consecutive decrease in the calf crop.



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
