

Broiler Market Continues Firm; Average 19.9 at Lancaster Auction

LANCASTER Aug 7 — Broiler prices at the Lancaster Poultry Exchange were slightly higher than a week ago with slightly fewer birds offered for sale. A total of 73,200 broilers averaged 19.94 cents a pound.

Only four lots of the 26 offered were withdrawn from the sale.

Prices at the sale ranged from 19 to 22 cents a pound. Eleven per cent of the sales were at 19 cents, two per cent at 19½ cents, 10 per cent at 19½ cents,

12 per cent at 19¾ cents, 46 per cent at 20 cents, six per cent at 20¼ cents, three per cent at 20½ cents, three per cent at 20¾ cents, four per cent at 21 cents and three per cent at 22 cents.

One lot of 700 white rock hens sold for 17 cents and 1,030 head of light type hens selling in two lots moved at 15¾ cents. A lot of 700 heavy fowl sold for 17 cents.

A year ago the market moved 118,350 broilers at an average of 22.75 cents a pound. Top price was 23¾ cents and the low was

22 cents.

Slaughter Cattle Mostly Active; Stockers & Feeders Slow at Lancaster

LANCASTER, Aug. 14 — CATTLE 2,313. Receipts slightly smaller than same time last week, supply mainly 950-1,250 lb good and choice slaughter steers. Slaughter heifers scarce. Stockers and feeders near 25 per cent of run and cows and bulls 15 per cent. Slaughter steers moderately active, fully steady. Cows active, mostly 25 cents higher. Bulls moderately active, steady to 25 cents lower. Stockers and feeders slow, steady to 50 cents lower, full decline on feeder steers over 700 lb.

Few loads 1,100-1,240 lb low prime slaughter steers with high good end \$27.90-28. Bulk choice slaughter steers \$26.27-25, load 1,000 lb high choice \$27.50.
