

Broiler Market Continues Steady; Lancaster Auction Moves 98,000 Head

LANCASTER, Aug. 14 — Increasing prices (even though slight) brought out more broilers than had been moved at the Lancaster Poultry auction any week since July 17. A total of 98,000 head in 25 lots brought prices ranging from 19 to 21 1/4 cents. Although the high for this week was down from last week's 22 cents, the total sale average was up slightly from 199 to 20 cents.

Growers appear to be optimistic about the rising prices. Five lots totaling 31,600 head were withdrawn from the sale after bids of 17 to 19 1/4 cents were offered.

In the corresponding sale last year broilers sold for 22 1/4 to 23 1/4 cents with 122,200 head averaging 22.69 cents.

Also sold were 875 head of White Leghorn and Rhode Island Red Fowl for 15 1/4 cents to 17 1/4 cents.

Four lots of capettes brought 23 to 26 1/2 cents for the 6,900 head.

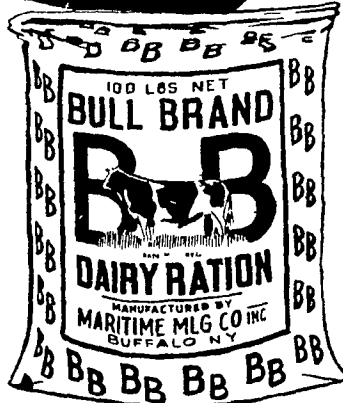
