About 3.5-million Americans 14 years of age or older do some farm work for wages, according to estimates by the U.S. Department of Agricultural. About 2-million of these persons worked 25 days or more, and almost 300,000 worked 300 days or more.

The dairy cow is the most efficient producer of calcium of any animal species, producing 10 times as much as the hen its nearest competitor in terms of converting calcium intake to calcium produced.
