

**Junior Dairy Show
To Be Held Sept. 18;
Large Entry List Seen**

HARRISBURG — The future of Pennsylvania's \$279,724,000 dairy industry will go on parade September 18 at the third Pennsylvania Junior Dairy Show in the State Farm Show Building in Harrisburg.

Future Farmers of America and 4-H Club members from all portions of the state will show animals of the six leading dairy breeds. These animals will already have placed in the blue ribbon group in district or regional shows.

In addition to blue ribbons and championship awards at the show the boys and girls will participate in fitting and showmanship contests for special prizes. National breed associations will make awards for the most outstanding animals entered in their breeds.

All blue ribbon winners will be entered automatically in the 1959 Farm Show next January.

Last year nearly 350 head of animals were put through their paces and the entry list is expected to be longer this year.

The State Junior Dairy Show was made possible two years ago by an appropriation by the General Assembly which was raised last year to \$15,000 each for the 1958 and 1959 shows, an increase of \$5,000 per year.

**Cattle Strong
To .50 Higher
At Baltimore**

BALTIMORE, Sept 2 —

CATTLE AND CALVES: Receipts made up of approximately 20 loads slaughter steers, four loads of slaughter heifers, nine loads stockers and heifers with the balance largely cows. The supply fell about 200 short of the early estimate. Slaughter steers under 1100 lb moderately active, weights over 1100 lbs. slow; all weights and grades strong to 50¢ higher. Slaughter heifers moderately active and steady. Cows active, fully steady with instances canners Bulls moderately active and 50¢ higher. Vealers slow and steady. Slaughter calves fully 50¢ higher Good clearance all classes.

STEERS: Two small lots 920-1030 lbs. high-choice and low-prime slaughter steers \$28 00-28.50, bulk 900-1100 lb good to average-choice \$25-27.50, bulk 1150-1320 lb. good grade steers \$24-25.75.

HEIFERS: Load 793 lb. good to low-choice slaughter heifers \$25 25, four lots 697-868 lb. standard and good \$22 50-24.25.

COWS & BULLS: Utility and commercial cows \$18-20. canners and cutter \$16-18, mostly \$16 50 and up and few light canners down to \$14 Utility and commercial bulls \$21.50-24. bulk \$22. and up.

VEALERS & CALVES: Bulk 160-260 lb. good choice vealers \$28-34. choice \$31. and up; few standard down to \$26. Bulk 260-450 lb. good and choice slaughter calves \$24-28, few under 300 lbs. up to \$29

STOCKERS & FEEDERS: Stockers and feeders moderately active and steady. Bulk 500-850 lb. medium and good stocker and feeder steers \$24-27 50, load 814 lb. good to choice flashy feeder steers included at \$26 50, short load 553 lb. mostly choice stock steers \$28.75, small lot 732 lb. common \$21.50. Load 475 lb. good and choice stock steer calves \$28 50, few 400-468 lb medium to good \$25-27.

HOGS: Receipts fell about 200 short of early estimate. Butchers active, 25-59¢ higher. Bulk supply mixed lots U. S. No. 1, 2, and 3, 190-240 lb butchers; these mainly \$21.25-21.50 with weights over 200 lbs. mostly at the latter price. 47 head largely No. 1 and 2, 215-230 lbs. \$21.75. Sizeable lot 239 lb. mixed weight and grade and sizeable lot with No. 1-3, 195 lb. garbage fed butchers \$21. Sizeable lot No. 3, 303 lb. butchers \$20.50.

**Supply Adequate; Trading Light
In Major Broiler Producing Areas**

The broiler market continued steady to lower in most of the major producing areas this week. The Delmarva market was quiet with trading light and a considerable portion at undertermined prices.

The Delmarva broiler feed ratio was lower at 3.5, with broilers averaging 17.15 cents and feed selling for \$98.14 a ton. Last week the ratio stood at 3.7 when broilers brought 18.42 cents and feed was selling for \$100.02 a ton.

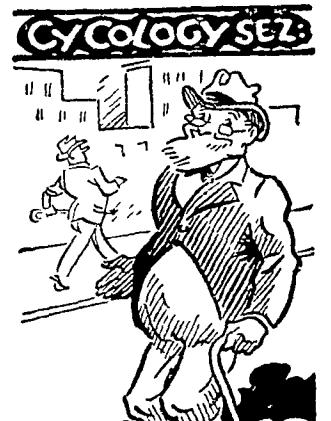

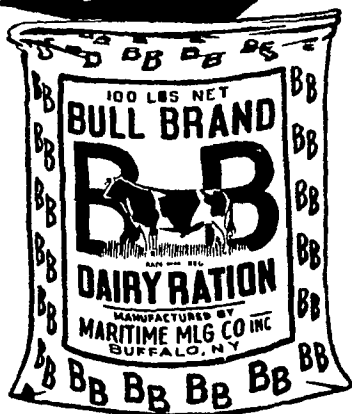

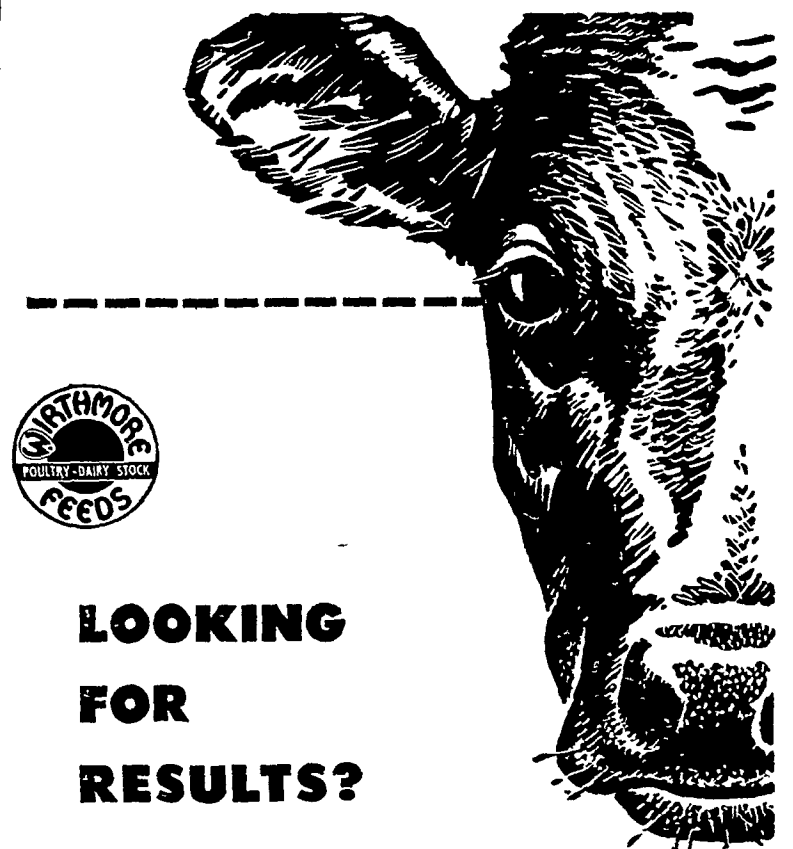
