3 PER CENT FEWER CATTLE IN CANADA
 Figures released last week by the Foreign Agricultural Service show that Canada's cattle population on June 1, 1958, totaled 11,001,000 head, a decrease of 3 per cent from June 1, 1957. For other types of livestock, sheep numbers

increased 2 per cent to 1,696,000 had as of June 1, 1958, hog numbers increased 29 per cent to 6,164,000 head, while the number of horses dropped 8 per cent to 675,000 during the year.

150 POUNDS OF MEAT

PER CAPITA FORECAST

Per capita consumption of all meats in 1958 currently is forecast by the Agricultural Marketing Service at 150 pounds. This would be 9 pounds less than last year and quite a bit below the record of 166.7 pounds set in 1956. Beef consumption is expected to be around 79 pounds per person,

down about 6 pounds from 1956 and 1957, and pork consumption at 60 pounds is slightly less than last year and is below average. Production of all meat in 1958 — beef, lamb, mutton, and pork — is expected to total around 25.9 billion pounds. This would be 4 per cent less than last year and 8 per cent below the record of 1956.

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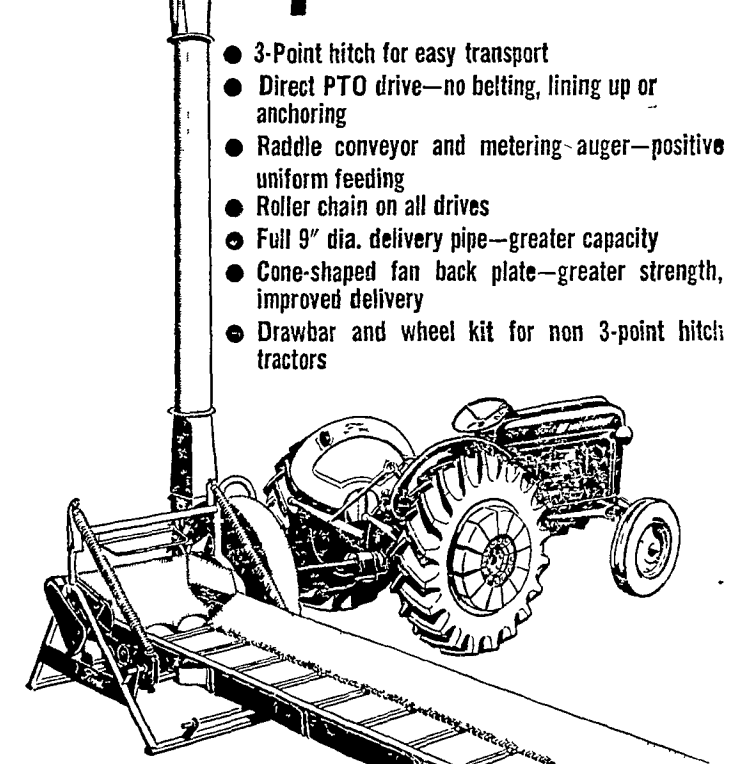
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
