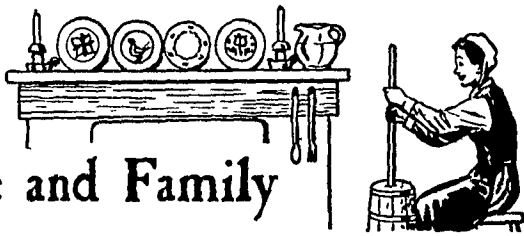

Sprinkle with crumbs and cinnamon. Bake at 375 degrees for 25 to 30 minutes.

DREAM BARS

- 1/2 cup butter
- 1/2 cup light brown sugar
- 1 cup flour

Cream together and then pat evenly on bottom of 8 x 13 pan and bake at 350 degrees for 10 minutes. Then spread the following on top carefully and quickly:

- 1 cup light brown sugar
- 2 eggs
- 2 tablespoons flour
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon baking powder

1 1/4 cups coconut and one cup chopped English walnuts, mixed

Bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes more. Cut in bars.

Refreshing punches are always a welcome treat. You might like to try this one.

TEA PARTY PUNCH

- 1 1/4 cups granulated sugar
- 1 cup hot water
- 3 cups orange juice
- 1 cup lemon juice (fresh, canned or frozen)
- 1 cup pineapple juice
- 1 cup raspberry juice
- 3 cups strong hot tea
- 1 quart chilled gingerale or sparkling water

Dissolve sugar in hot water. Add hot tea and chill. Add the other ingredients and serve.

SUGAR CAKES

- 2 cups granulated sugar
- 1 cup lard
- 3 eggs
- 1 cup buttermilk
- 4 cups flour
- 1 teaspoon soda

Lemon flavoring. Combine as for regular cake.

Bake at 400 degrees on top rack of oven for 8 to 10 minutes.

PEANUT BUTTER DROPS

- 1 1/2 cup sifted flour
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 cup shortening
- 1/2 cup peanut butter
- 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1 cup sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1/2 cup water
- 1 cup rolled oats (optional)
- 2 cups chocolate chips

Sift together flour, soda and salt. Blend shortening, peanut butter, nutmeg and cinnamon. Beat in sugar gradually. Beat in eggs one at a time. Add flour mixture alternately with water. Lastly, add rolled oats and chocolate chips. Drop by teaspoonfuls on ungreased cookie sheet. Bake at 375 degrees for 12 minutes. Roll while warm in sugar. Makes about 8 dozen.

An adequate breakfast for your child should include the following: fruit or juice, preferably citrus as a reliable and rich source of C vitamin, milk, toast and cereal, toast and egg, or cereal and egg. 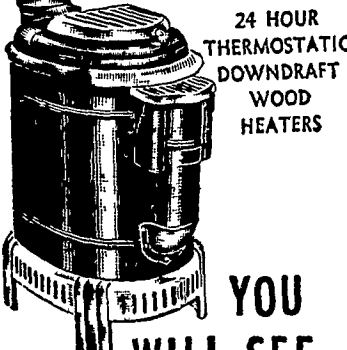
