

INCREASES GAINS

Tests at the Kentucky Agricultural Experiment Station indicate daily gains of steers can be increased 0.48 pound by using a combination of a synthetic hormone and an antibiotic. Dr. W. P. Garrigus, head of the animal husbandry section and A. R. Parsons, beef specialist at the Kentucky station, say implants of 12- and 24-milligram pellets of diethylstilbestrol in the ear of yearling Angus steers resulted in an average daily gain of 0.26 pound higher than non-implanted steers. Addition of 80 milligrams of terramycin to the salt each steer was eating daily produced an additional daily gain of 0.22 pounds.

Broiler Prices Continue to Drag In Most Major Markets Areas In Nation

This week's Delmarva broiler — feed ratio held at 3.3 as the broiler price per pound dropped to 16-10. Price of 20 per cent broiler mash dropped from \$98.56 per ton to \$97.28, \$2.12 above the feed price one year ago, but \$2.31 under six months ago.

Broiler — feed ratio one year ago was 4.7 and 4.4 six months ago, as broiler prices were .784 and 21.72 respectively.
