 Rancid flavor in milk may be caused by rapid cooling of freshly drawn milk. When researchers at the Oklahoma Experiment Station delayed the cooling of fresh milk for about one hour, development of a rancid flavor was prevented in at least 80 per cent of the samples studied Accordingly the researchers recommend an hour's delay in cooling the first milk put into the tank where rancid flavor is a problem

Broiler-Feed Ratio Continues Drop To 3.1, With Feed Up — Broilers Off

The Delmarva Broiler Feed ratio this week skidded to a disheartening 3.1, as the pound price in that area dropped to 15.36 and the per ton price of 20 per cent broiler mash rose to \$98.90  
 The ratio was off 0.5 from one year ago, 1.3 from six months ago and 0.2 from last week Broiler prices last week in the Delmarva area were at 16.10
