

Red Rose Baby Beef Club Rolls Close for 4-H'ers on Oct. 15

Lancaster County Agent Max Smith has announced enrollment in the county-wide Red Rose Baby Beef Club, will close October 15.

Eligible young people may enroll by contacting Smith or one of the six following 4-H Club leaders:

Ira Rutt, Peach Bottom Fried W. Linton, Quarryville, RD 2, Harry Showalter, Reinholds, RD 1, Mylin R. Good, Manheim RD 1; Jay R. Nissley, Manheim RD 4, and Vivtor Longenecker, Elizabethtown RD 3.

Prospective beef club members will have a choice of the three major beef breeds. After signing up of members is completed, a committee selects feeder calves from available stock, and club members file for a drawing for a steer of the breed of their choice.

At the drawing (dates will be announced later), as each club member's name is drawn, he or she receives a pick of the animals in the order of draw.

"The idea of the club, Smith said, is to take a small steer and feed it out to the very best condition possible in about 12 months."

Dried Egg Plan Slated for U.S. School Lunches

The U. S. Department of Agriculture announced today plans to purchase dried whole egg solids for the National School Lunch Program. Details of the program will be announced early next week, calling for weekly offerings until further notice. The amount to be purchased weekly will depend upon prices and quantities offered.

Purchases will be made with funds transferred by Congress from Section 32 for use under the National School Lunch Act. Distribution will be limited to schools participating in the National School Lunch Program.

Schools were supplied with whole egg solids in 1957 and they were widely accepted by school lunch officials. Dried whole egg solids are a product developed in recent years through cooperative research by the egg drying industry, the military services, and the USDA.

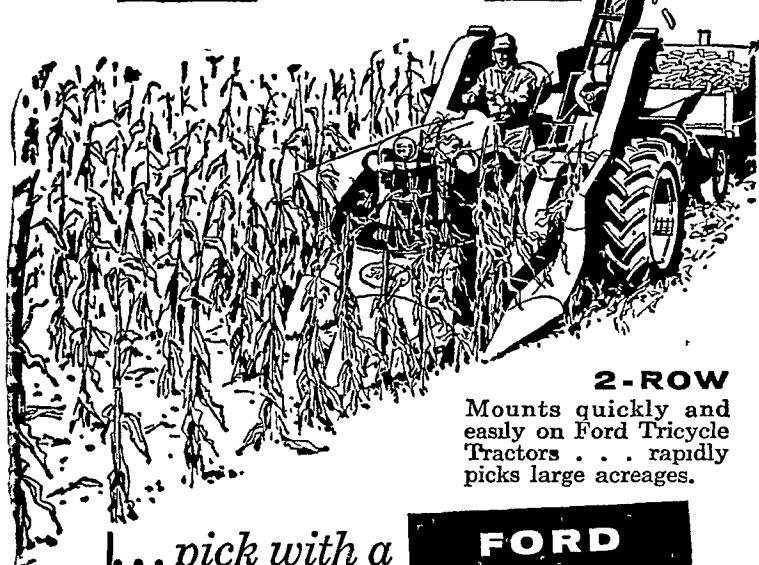

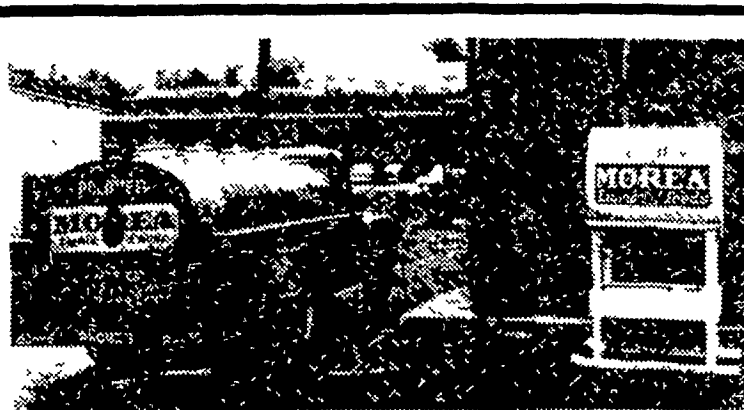
