

Delmarva Broilers Off to 15.90; Georgia, Alabama, Carolina — 15

Delmarva's broiler-feed ratio for the week ending Oct 10, dropped one point from the previous week's 35 to 34, due to a half cent fall off in broiler prices, although feed prices dropped 80 cents per ton on 20 per cent broiler mash.

The Delmarva broiler average slacked off to 15.90 as compared with 16.42 the previous week, 1930 six months ago and 17.01 one year ago.

The ratio is two points below last year's 36 mark.

The Delmarva market for the week was steady, with offerings moderate, demand fair. Prices paid at the farm. Broiler and fryers 2½ lb. and over, mostly 3-3½ lbs., 15-16, 50,813 head. Eight per cent 15-15½, 60% 15½-16, 10% 16-16½ inclusive. Eleven per cent undetermined 11% intra company transfers.

Caponettes 17.70-24 Eastern Shore Poultry Growers Exchange Oct. 10 volume 544,600 head. Volume sold 536,000 head. Prices ranged 15.10-16.20. Mostly 15.50-15.80. All sizes 3-4 lbs. well distributed in most ranges. Also sold two lots caponettes 1,900 head pullets, 4½ lb. 17.70, and 850

cockerels, 6 lb at 21.60. Other major broiler production areas report the week's market as follows

Buyers offerings prices and volume Monday: Broilers and fryers 2¾ lb to 3¼ at farm 15¢, 796,000 head. FOB plants 16¢, 386,000 head. Fri. and Sat; Range 15-15½, 977,000 head, 88% at 15, 9% at 15½, 3% book at 15, FOB plants 16, 619,000 head, 80% at 16¢, 20% intra company sales booked at 16.

NORTH CAROLINA. Offerings fully adequate at some points barely adequate at others. Demand varies from slow to good generally fair. Prices Monday: Broilers and fryers 2¾-3½ lbs. at farm 15, 569,500 head. 88% at 15, 12% undetermined. Heavy hens, 15-17, mostly 16-17.

SHENANDOAH VALLEY: Broilers and fryers, demand fair to good. Supply adequate. Prices paid at farm 2½-3½ lbs. at 15.8, 284,100 head, 51% at 15, 7% at 15½, 1% at 15½, 12% at 15.8, 29% undetermined. Weekly sum-

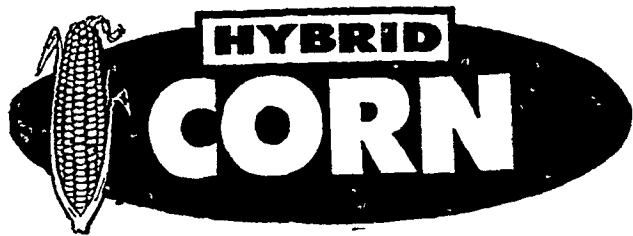
