The ornamental nursery management option prepares young men for jobs in plant propagation, field production, and use and maintenance of trees, shrubs, and flowers. Such trained people will be in demand for some time. Dr. McClay points out, because of increasing population and continual building of new homes. Fifteen new students have pre-registered.

Turfgrass management courses train supervisors and managers for golf courses, municipal and industrial parks and playgrounds,

cemeteries, highway roadsides, estates and airfields. Personnel trained in these positions are also in demand. Pre-registration numbers: 28.

The training for winter course students includes written and spoken English, chemistry, botany, citizenship, physical education, and health. Students have about the same privileges as regular four-year students and receive a certificate upon graduation.

15th New Holland Sales Stables Dairy Show and Sale Is Success

The 15th Annual New Holland Sales Stable's Dairy Show and Sale resulted in average bids of \$582 per cow for the first 20 cows exhibited in the all-day Wednesday affair, according to John Gingrich, auction manager.

A total of 250 dairy cows were sold in the auction following the show, which saw 160 purebred and grade animals competing.

Highest price of the auction was brought by a three-year-old purebred Holstein, shown by Elam K. Burkholder, New Holland. The cow justified her top standing in breed by bringing \$850 for Burkholder. Purchaser was Joe Stoltzfus, Morgantown.

The second place Holstein, a grade cow shown by Ira Shenk, Hershey, was purchased by Alfred Albright, Landisburg, for \$600.

Third place Holstein, exhibited by Hostetter Brothers, Annville, was bought by Henry Lapp, Gordonville, for \$530.

John I. Fritz, Smoketown swept the top three honors in the Guernsey breed division with three entries, all of which were purchased by Joe Walters, Douglasville, for a combined total of \$1140, averaging \$380 each.

In the mixed breeds division, Fritz Brothers, Smoketown exhibited the 1st place cow, which was bought by Abram Ebersold, Bareville, for \$375.

John Buchter, Stevens, sold the 2nd place cow in this division for \$395 to Max Baum, Saunders-town.

The third place mixed breeds cow, shown by Hostetter Bros., was bid in by Charles Myers, Millersville, for \$350.

Gingrich said the stable's management was very satisfied with the entries in the show and sale and the large crowd, which demonstrated spirited bidding, especially in competition for the higher placing animals. "Our average was above last year on the auction," he added.

REA Approves Penna. Loan

The Rural Electrification Administration approved two electric loans totaling \$673,000 last week to borrowers in Iowa and Pennsylvania, the U. S. Department of Agriculture announced today.

The loans will finance the construction of 45 miles of distribution line to bring initial electric service to nearly 400 farmers and other rural consumers. Various system improvements, including four new substations, are also provided for in the loans.

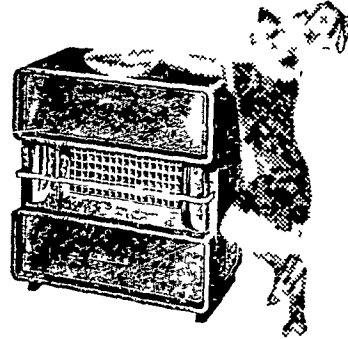
