

## Kiwanians Sponsor County 4-H Capon Round-Up

The 1958 Lancaster County 4-H Capon Club round-up Tuesday attracted a total of 27 entries of two birds each to the annual event sponsored by Lancaster Kiwanis International club.

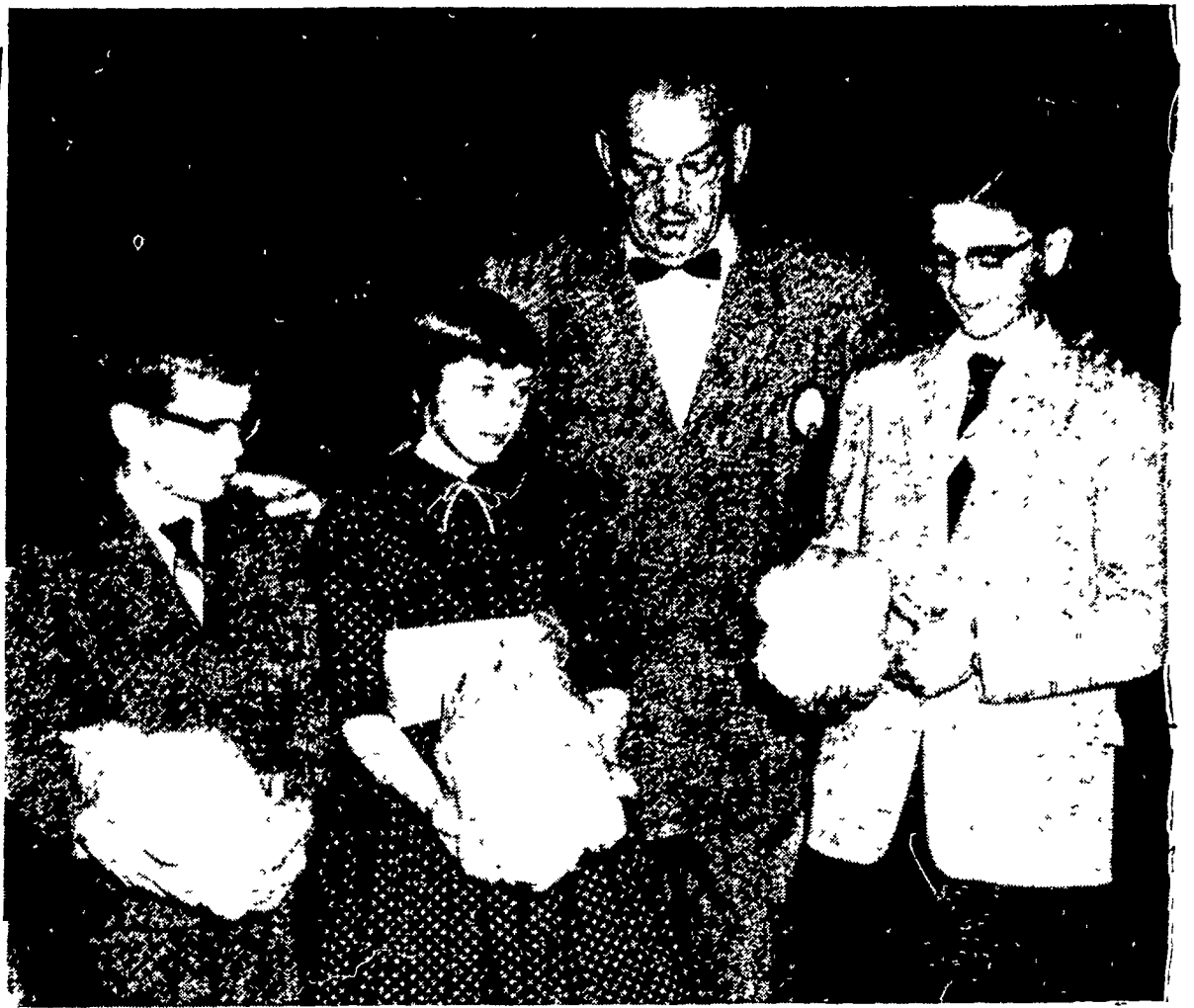
Eleven-year-old Carolyn Wilson, Bareville RD 1, won first place in overall project score based on the final placing of her dressed birds, records books and project management. The daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William Wilson scored a total of 99.25 points of a possible 100 to judge David Lapp, also Bareville PD 1, for the total project honors.

The dressed bird exhibit was judged by Carl O. Dossin, Penn State extension poultry specialist. Dossin termed the overall exhibit, "Excellent". Lapp scored a perfect 20

points in the exhibit contest with a capon pair weighing 15 1/4 pounds, dressed and oven-ready. The top duo collected \$22 in prizes offered by the sponsoring Kiwanians, while selling their prize birds for a premium 65 cents per pound.

Gary Porter, Washington Boro RD 1, placed third in the exhibit; James Groff, Lancaster RD 7, placed fourth, and Lois Overgaard, Lancaster RD 4, placed fifth.

Overall project winners behind Carolyn and David were Robert M. and William Wilson, Carolyn's brothers, with a 98.15 score, Porter, scoring 98, Miss Overgaard, 97.9, Roberta Landis, Lancaster RD 3, 97.8, Faye Doerr, Millersville RD 2, 97.7, Anna Pearl Lapp, 97.5, and Groff, 97.25.

## Cease and Desist Order Issued

### Against Baltimore Auction by USDA

The US Department of Agriculture announced today that all charges against the Baltimore Livestock Auction Market, Inc., of West Friendship, Md., have been satisfactorily settled without a hearing, and that the company has consented to the issuance of a cease and desist order.

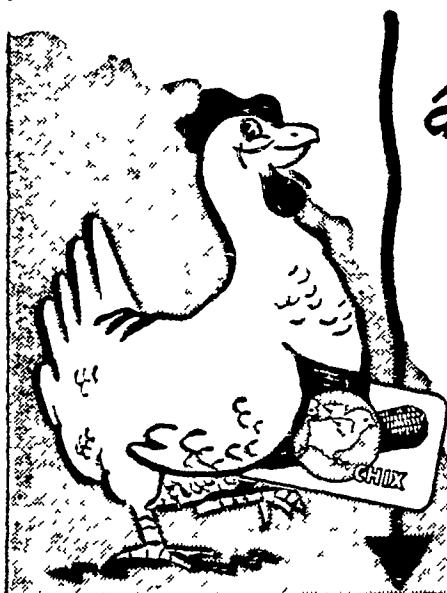
The Baltimore Livestock Auction Market, Inc. has admitted the charges made public by USDA Sept. 22, and has agreed to discontinue these practices. Specifically these involved a company officer to speculate in consigned livestock and not assess

ing commission on livestock sold by him, also permitting the officer to issue incorrect accounts of sale by not showing the true purchaser of the livestock.

The respondent also has agreed to keep proper books and records and to no longer use shippers' proceeds for purposes of its own.

The Baltimore Livestock Auction Market, Inc., has waived hearing, and consented to the entry of a cease and desist order which was issued today by USDA's Judicial Officer Thomas J. Flavin.
